URUGUAYAN FINANCIAL

(The following lengthy article appeared under the above title in the London Financial News of Jan. 26, the same number containing a full translation of President Herrera's Message on Economies and new Taxes. Whilst reproducing it as of interest to our readers, we do not wish it to be assumed that we entirely agree with the conclasions of our contemporary.)

Whatever may be the precise motive animating the presidential message, it has a fine flavour of heroic sacrifice. It teems with the most ardent expressions of good faith towards the country's creditors; it declares that anything-everything-must be done rather than that sacred obligations rather than that sacred obligations in the matter of interest should be ignored. Uruguay is asked to immolate herself on the altar of financial integrity. Her Government officials are aplauded tor the patriotic way in which they do their work without getting their salaries. Her people are told that they must henceforth not only cut their coat according to their cloth: but must be content to pay a higher price for the that the year has been one of prosperity and progress.

meet all her obligations and strike a fair balance. Time will show. The Uruguayans will certainly be none the worse, in any event, for having to undergo the wholesome experience of retrenchment. They have contrived to a really set. experience of retrenchment. They have contrived, for a small nation, to pile up a crushing burden of indebtedness. As far back as 1886 when the debt amounted to \$69,175,000, it was declared to be too heavy a burden for the population; but by July last it had reached a total of \$90,741,000—an increase of \$21,566,000, or about 30 per cent. This increase has been continuous and systematic. Of the existing This increase has been continuous and systematic. Of the existing total, a sum of \$79,291,000, or £16,870,000, forms the external debt, the remainder consisting of internal obligations. In comparison with the population, the liability appears exceedingly large; for, according to a report by the British consul at Montevideo, the country only possesses about 680,000 people, so that the indettedness per head so that the indebtedness per head is no less than £28. In hardly any other country, except Argentina and the Australasian colonies, is the National Debt so heavy. Still, it is often urged that, after all, Uruguay has great natural resources, and that in view of their possibilities of development, the National Debt is by no means so excessive as it appears; but, judging from the consul's report, this is by no means

To take just one indication: trade has not expanded to anything like the extent that might have been expected from the rapid growth in the expenditure of the country. The figures are follow:—

The marked increase in the imports is due in a measure, of course, to the growth of population, but largely, no doubt, to the extension of largely, no doubt, to the extension of the railway system, which has been developed by foreign capital, aided by State guarantees. As regards the exports, it is thought that the totals are smaller than taey should be ow-ing to the trade which passes unno-ticed over the Brazilian frontier; still no allowance that may be read still, no allowance that may be made on this account can offset the fact that there has been little increase in the value of the exports during the past five years. The revenue shows, of course, a large increase, the total having risen from \$11,720,000 in 1885-86 to \$15,690,000 in 1888-89; but this has resulted almost wholly from an expansion in the customs receipts. In fact, Mr. Satow, the British consul, does not consider that any great increase in the resour-ces of Uruguay is possible under present conditions. He says that, in the opinion of good judges, the terri-tory of the Republic now carries as bout that situation. their vices. Their virtues, happily, many head of sheep and horned stock are to be spared a visit from the tax-«increase of the netional wealth can be looked for from this source.» It is, he says, to an extension of agriculture that attention must now be turned, but in this direction develop-ment is hampered in several ways. The country is well suited for agriculture, but labour is scarce and dear, while the want of good roads greatly detracts from the value of the railtion with the railway system is, in fact, indispensable to the profitable development of the grazing and agricultural industries. Until this necessity is recognised and dealt with, Mr. Satow says that the future

progress of Uruguay must be at an extremely slow rate.

To remove the impediments that clog the development of the Republic estimated expenditure for the year stood at \$14,934,000, of which debts and guarantees represented 6,889,988 dollers and pensions \$2,181,000.

Neither of these items was susceptible of a reduction. They were fixed charges, and stood at the irreducible minimum. That left only reducible minimum. fore, is anything but a hopeful one; and it is not easy to see where relief and it is not easy to see where relief is to come from. That Uruguay desires to be honest is quite possible, but, unfortunately, she seems likely to lack the power of fulfilling her obligations for very long, notwithstanding increased taxation and a spurt of economic self-denial. No immediate difficulties need be apprehended; for the April coupon is provided for, and if Congress vote the fiscal changes, the evil day may the fiscal changes, the evil day may be postponed. It is not an agreeable task to be the prophet of disaster or to point out unpleasant facts to people who have made mistakes; but it is better to do this than to let them live in delusion from which there must, one day, be a rude awakening. No doubt, most investors have grasped the fact pretty fully that Uruguay is in dire financial straits; but few, we imagine realise how livele reliance can be placed upon consumption—\$2,018,000, or, if the consumption be reduced in consequence by 25 per cent., \$1,888,420.

Adding the amount saved in expenditure, a financial gain of \$3,038,697 is obtained in the one case, and of \$2,409,107 in the other.

-The Government Engineer of the Port Works. Sr. Stavelius, reports that \$15,981,200 has been expended out of the \$20,000,000 gold authoriz-ed by the law of 27th October 1882, and that a further sum of \$17,820,360 gold will be required for completing the works, exclusive of the dry docks, the construction of which has not been decreed.

The Council of Public Works has therefore submitted to the Govern-ment a proposal for the application of the balance available, giving pre-ference to the North Basin and to the dredging on that side, and using any surplus in completing the rail-ways on the wharfs and in the ex-cavation of Dock No. 3, but suspending the masonry work in that dock.

BARON HIRSCH AND THE JEWS.

It is now some time since Baron Hirsch announced his intention of devoting twelve millions of francs for the benefit of distressed Jewish families, especially those in Russia Galicia, and the Bukovina. The plan adopted for the application of this magnificent sum of money was to acquire farming land, divide it into suitable, all threats, for families acquire farming land, divide it into suitable allotments for families, supply the necessary stock, and make provision for initiating the prospective occupiers in the mysteries of agriculture. It had been decided to make the first trial in Argentina, and the practical arrangements had been completed for giving effect to the beneficent scheme, when news was received which induced the managers to make further inquiry before magersto make furtherinquiry before carrying out their plan. It appears that the experience of Jewish emi-grants already settled in that district ot South America has been far from agreeable. They suffer a great deal from persecution, and many of them are in quite as deep distress as they were before leaving the old country. It has been determined, therefore, to send out a commission of inquiry, and until its report has been received poor Jews are warned not to seek a home or settlement in Argentina.— Daily Chronicle.
