Message.

The following Message respecting the accounts of the Executive Power and the General Budget for 1891-2 has been addressed to the Legislative Chambers, bearing the date March 19, but only just published .-

The Law of August 8, 1883, after establishing that the economic year of the Republic shall commence on July 1 and conclude on June 30 following, orders that the E. P. shall present the accounts mentioned in Art. 82 of the Constitution fifteen days after the opening of the sessions of the Legislative Body.

The nearly always abnormal circumstances in which the country has been since the promulgation of that law, have occasioned great delay in the fulfilment of the duty thus imposed upon the E P.

At present, the situation being already rendered normal in many of its aspects, that which makes difficult the presentation of accounts in February is that the collection of the Licence Taxes (Patentes) instead of being carried out by the economic year, is carried out by the civil year according to legal precept, and thus, in the month or August, it is impossible yet to close the accounts which the Direction General of Direct Taxes should send to the general Account-ant's office as one of the indispensable plete, enjoyable and artistic performance. trol within a few days.

The law mentioned also directs that the Bill of the General Budget should be presented before April 1. In scarcely a single year has this precept been exactly complied with, and the E. P. regrets to have to say that it will also be impossible to fulfil this.

Although freed from the financial perturbations of the moment, the question of the Budget is singularly complicated. That which was sanctioned for 1889-90 was discussed and voted en bloc, upon months that the bases which were not written bases whish were not strictly adjusted to the true state of

These modifications were never discussed. The crisis that was evolved in July made all the calculations problematical, and the Hon. General Assembly preferred simply to pro-long the previous Budget, which, being already inadequate for 1889-90 was still more so for the present pe-

This situation was prolonged throughout the first half-year. A laudable idea of economy and of order in presence of the difficulties which besieged the Government, inspired the Law of January 30 by which there were made to be seen by which there were made reductions in the salaries, which have been strictly fulfilled, suppressions of posts and other diminutions of expenses, which the E. P. continues to realise so far as the inevitable exigencies of administrative and the salaries.

The E. P. therefore hopes that, in your opinion, the task which it has taken upon itself, in the just desire of once for all regulating Public Admiministration upon the base of a completely sincere and perfectly balan-ced Budget, will be sufficient motive to justify a certain amount of inevitable delay in the presentation of the respective Bill.

It is nearly certain that you will receive this Bill before the end of April, accompanied by all the docu-ments which have served for its formation, which will render easier its study and discussion and it will thus be possible to sanction it, with such modifications as you may deem necessary, before July 1, as is exact-ed by the Law of August 8, 1882.

So far as the strike at Cardiff is concerned, the only matter of interest occurring yesterlay was the publication of a statement by Mr. Mann, in reply to Sir W. T. Lewis's letter, and a manifesto by Mr. J. H.

Eleven families, numbering about a hundred persons, were evicted on Friday from Lord Londouderry's Silkworth Colliery, near Sunderland. Nearly all the doors of the houses had to be forced open with crowbars. There was intense excitement among the ten thousand persons who watched the operations. Further evictions will take place to-day, there being about three thousand people to be turn-

The remains of General Sherman were borne through New York on Friday en route for Saint Louis. Nearly twenty thousand troops took part in the procession to the Pennsylvania Railway Terminus. President Harrison, two ex-Presidents, the members of the Cabinet, and a great number of high officials and distin-guished American accompanied the procession. All business was suspend-

ed in the city In addition to Sir. Edward Wat-kins Channel Tunnel scheme, and Sir Edward Reed's Tube Tunnel, a third plan has been projected, and has been submitted for the consideration of the Postmaster-General. This consists of a tunnel bored much on the lines of the South Eeastern projected, but the bore not to be of greater magnitude than necessary to convey the mails and find room for the telegraph wires, thus avoiding the expense of cable lines. It is claimed that the adoption of this scheme would save two hours in the transmission of Continental mails, whilst it would add considerably to the certainty of

The families dispossessed have been afforded temporary accommodation in a Primitive Methodist chapel and in a mission room con nected with the parish church. At the present rate of progress the evictions will, it is expected, take something like six weeks.

The subject of the shipping crisis was referred to at the annual meeting of the Chamber of Shipping, in the Cannon-street Hotel, yesterday, but no resolution was passed. At a late late hour last night the Federation of Trades and Labour Unions addressed a circular to individual shipowners, protesting against the resolution passed by the council of the Shipping Federation on Thursday.

We learn from Washington that the House Committee has decided adversely on the Senate's Free Coinage Bill. It has recommended
