MONTEVIDEO, MARCH 21, 1891. THE MIDLAND OF URUGUAY RAILWAY.

«The position of the Midland of Uruguay Railway Company is giving much anxiety to the proprietors, and not without serious cause. No payment has as yet been received by the company from the Government on account of the guarantee, though an instalment fell due, and ought to have been paid a year ago. The debenture interest due last November would not have been paid had not a financial house in the City advanced the funds, and it is very uncertain what will happen when the next coupon falls due in May, as the traffic does not as yet cover working expenses. Unless the Government can be made to pay something on account of the guarantee it is highly probable that the debenture interest will be in default What will be the course then taken by the proprietors remains to be seen. The debenture bonds, unfortunately for the holders, are not mortgage debentures, and, therefore, according to recent decisions, they are only in a somewhat better posi-tion than preference shares; that is, they have only a preferential right to be paid interest and to be paid off at par in case the property is sold. The dividend is, however, cumula-tive, and, in the event of Uruguay ultimately meeting its obligations, it must be paid with arrears in full. Meantime, the shareholders ought seriously to consider what can be

done to improve the situation without waiting until they are actually driven into a corner. Every available means should be taken publicly and means should be taken publicly and privately to bring pressure on the Uruguayan Government. It will be observed that they have paid their direct obligations, such as the interest on their foreign debt, and on the internal bonds held by the Central Uruguay Railway and the Montevideo Waterworks, but they, apparently, completely disregard their more indirect liabilities. The guarantee on the North-West of guarantee on the North-West of Uruguay Railway is also consider-ably overdue, and very soon the Uruguay Northern Railway will also be becoming dependent on its Government guarantee, when a similar state of affairs will probably occur. So long as these guarantees are not met Uruguay is distinctly a defaulting State, and ought to be publicly recognised as such. It is not just to give the preference to any set of creditors, and the holders of scallway guarantees ought to particirailway guarantees ought to participate in the funds sent to meet the

But it seems to us that the duty of the directors of these railways does not end with merely protesting and remonstrating with the Government. The Message is signed by the President and all the Ministers.

The Midland Railway Guarantee.

There was a report in town yes-terday morning that the Government had paid, in London, some or all of the guarantee due on the Midland of Uruguay railway, and this, it was said, accounted for the sudden jump of nearly 5 points in the quotation of the Unified Debt in London, a rise which at present is not understood here. We have made enquiries here, and are able to state most positively that nothing is known in the most likely quarters here about any such

payment.
Mr, J.J. Gardiner, the manager of the Midland Railway, is at present in Montevideo, on his way to England. (Several contemporaries have stated that he has already left, but that is incorrect.) He is negotiating with Government concerning the guarantee, being desirous of taking with him some definite proposition, and he reports that the Government is doing its utmost to give a satisfactory solution to the difficulty and to satisfy the shareholders. He will be absent from Uruguay some four or five months, and during his absence his duties as Manager of the Railway will be undertaken by the first ac-countant, Mr. A. Warren Jones.

He has also been charged with presenting to the Ministry of Foment a petition for the dragging of the Paso de Almiron, which, if carried out, will greatly facilitate traffic between the river and the railway.

The long aunounced production of Shakespeare's tragedy «King Lear» took place at this theatre on Thurs-day evening, and, considering the tremendous difficulties of the play, with all the success possible under the circumstances. The Italian version follows the original with fidelity, though the great length of the piece renders necessary the elimination of several scenes without which the plot several scenes without which the plot is hardly intelligible to one not familiar with the text. As little could be done for the scenic and spectacular effects, the interest was centred in the acting and especially in therendering given by Sr. Emmanuel the rendering given by Sr. Emmanuel to the part of the king. This rôle is, to our thinking, the most absolutely difficult in the whole gallery of the drama, the greatest actors have hesitated to undertake it, and some of the greatest have undertakenit and have failed. If therefore we say that Sr. Emmannel, did not entirely reach our ideal of the part, it must not be thought that we wish to un-derrate his merits as an artist. King

Lear is nothing if not pa-thetic, no more pathetic fi-gure was ever conceived, and it was just this pathos which Sr. Emmanuel, in our judgment, did not portray. His performance appealed more to the head than the heart. It was the performance of a finished artist, it was conscientiously studied and carried out with great knowledge of stage effect, but it did not altogether reach our sympathies. When we were touched, it was more by the pathos of the scene than of the actor. We admired, but, somehow, Sr. Emmanuel's personality was more strongly before us than that of the King, and consequently we never lost sight of the actor. We think, however, that Sr. Emmanuel is sufficiently cleveran artist to conquer this final step, and by imparting to his personation the one necessary touch of nature now lacking, to draw tears from his audience as well as applause. With respect to some of the details of the performance to make his senile rage in the first act more violent and less restrained. From the first Shakespeare represents King Lear as of violent temper, verging on madness. The old king more than once expresses his fear of going mad and makes reference to the hysterica passio which is the prelude to insanity. The restraint of Sr. Em-manuel hardly conveyed this. His most successful effect was at the close of the 3rd act where he says «No, I'll of the 3rd act where he says «No, I'll not weep, I have full cause of weeping,» etc. This was admirably given, and he was more genuinely pathetic in this than in any other passage. The mad scene on the heath was well acted, but lostits power through the very deficient scenic effects. Moreover it was ridiculous to see the old king wet and soiled and the other characters on the stage, supposed to be equally exposed to the storm, neat and dry. The intensely pathetic scene where the old King recognises. Cordelia did not produce its due Cordelia did not produce its due effect, and we think Sr. Emmanuel erred in prolonging the climax after the lines «As I am a man I think this lady to be my child, Cordelia.» The death scene was good, but almost too short. The gowns worn by Sr. Emmanuel may have been correct, but they were not very picturesque, and their occasionally ludicrous effect did not assist the difficulties of the part. The same remark applies to the very unbecoming dresses of the

With regard to the other characters, Sta. Reiter is a very able actress, but her style is entirely unsuited to Cordelia, and she seemed to be conscious of it. Sr. De Mori gave a very manly and sympathetic render-ing of Kent. Sr. Ristori was badly ing of Kent. Sr. Ristori was badly made up as the Fool, but acted the part well, Sr. Grisanti was good as Edmund and Sr. Migliore the reverse as Edgar. The other parts were efficiently played, and the piece had been very carefully rehearsed and went with great smoothness.
