CONVERSION.

Yesterday the National Bank resumed entire conversion of its notes, which had been suspended since July 5, 1890.

Although we have been and still are opponents of the Bank on its present system of organisation we cannot but do it the justice to recognise the importance of this fact and to congratulate the Executive Power, which has strained every nerve to bring about this consummation, on having fulfilled its day. To attain this, there is no doubt that great sacrifices have been forced on the entire country. All other ends have been subordinated to the rescue of the Bank. It may be doubted whether the end has been worth the means, but, given the end, we must at least offer our congratulations on seeing it attained, and on seeing that the great pains taken have not, in this case, been fruitless. It is a triumph, we might almost say the first triumph for the present Government, and it has been achieved, in no slight measure, in the teeth of public opinion, and against formidable active and passive resistance.

Once more then, the entire currency of the Republic is on a solid metallic basis, or, to use the local phrase, we have returned to a gold regimen. But, whilst congratulating the Government on the successful carrying out of this part of its programme, we must not forget what was due to the stern attitude of commerce at the commencement of the crisis, last July. We cannot kelp thinking that if it had not been for the implacable resistence then shewn to the circulation of inconvertible notes, we might have been plunged into the sea of paper money which has swamped our Argentine neighbours and proved disastrous to the finances of other South American States. Finding the attempt to foist an inconvertible currency on the Republic useless, the Executive rightly directed all its energies to the restoration of conversion, and has succeeded. For the present the clashing interests are reconciled, and we sincerely hope there will be no necessity for a renewal of the conflict.

So far, good, but we must not be too sanguine, nor fall into the error that the crisis is yet dominated, or even that the National Bank is entirely rescued. Much will have to be done before it can be restored to the fulness of its functions, and lend to commerce that assistance for which it was ostensibly founded. The Minister of Finance then made a very lengthy speech in defense of the Bill. He said the Executive had recognised the futility of the existing law, but, as it was necessary to sustain a tax for the sake of the revenue, it was proposed to do so by imposing an equal tax on all alcohols equally divided between all the manufacturers in proportion to their output. The Municipal and Customs Analytical Offices might safely be trusted to guard against the sale of noxious falsified liquors. There was no necessity for legislative reform on this point. Local wine manufacture was favoured by the exemption of all duty and the free introduction of machinery. A protectionist tariff was a necessity of the country. He was strongly opposed to free trade. At present our Customs protection was only moderate, and helped the growth of native industries. Later on the E. P. would propose a substitutory Bill tor that of the Com-

The Republic of Uruguay.

The 120.13 head, and per inhabitant, 34.64. The above figures are those of the Anuario Estadistico, published at Montevideo in 1889. In the tables posted up in the Pavilion of Uruguay at the Paris Exhibition, the total number of cattle existing in the republic was stated to be 32 millions having a value of 407 millions of francs, an ox being estimated at 60 francs, a horse at 30 francs, sheep at four francs, and a pig at 30 francs. The difference of 10 million head is more than the normal increase of two years. The discrepancy, however, need not astonish us. The Spanish-Americans have become of late years indetatigable compilers of statistical tables, but few or these tables resist careful scrutiny and control. We must be content to accept the figures given as being more or less exact. These enormous totals mean clearly that Uruguay is essentially a pastoral country. Agriculture, we find, is developed only in the departments of Montevideo, Canelones and Colonia; in the departments of the interior it has not made any notable progress. Nevertheless the country produces more cereals than are needed for home consumption, and in 1887 upward of four million of francs' worth of grain was exported. Efforts have been made to cultivate vines in Uruguay, and the experiments promise to be successful.

An industry derived from the pastoral is that of the saladerosestablishments where animals are killed, and their hides, flesh etc., salted or otherwise utilized. In Misiones 130, Montevideo Uruguay the great saladeros are at Montevideo, at the foot of the Cerro, and at Fray Bentos, Paysandu, and Salto, on the Urnguay River. At Montevideo one of the best saladeros for visiting is that of Cibils, but in all the establishments the processes of slaughtering and cutting up are the same, and the scene of bloodshed equally nauseating. The meat, cut into long bands, salted, and dried in the sun, becomes charqui or tasajo, and is exported in bags, chiefly to Brazil and Cuba. The demand, however, is decreasing, and consequently, both in Uruguay and in the Argentine, great efforts are being made to organize the exportation of live cattle and refrigerated meat on a grand scale to European ports. At present between 700,000 and 800,000 head of cattle are killed every year in the republic of Uruguay, and nearly half that total is slaughtered

in the saladeros of Montevideo. The population of the Republica Oriental del Uruguay was estimated in 1888 at 687,194 souls. The latest census of the department of Montevideo, taken November 18, 1889, gave a total of 214,682 inhabitants, comprising 114,578 natives and 100,-104 foreigners, of whom fourfifths live in the city of Montevideo
