



Orme was much better yesterday. No decision has yet been arrived at as to his running in the Derby.

The inquest on the bodies of the two girls Emma Shirvell and Alice Marsh, who had died under mysterious circumstances after having been visited by a man known as 'Fred,' in a room which they occupied at 118, Stamford-street, Blackfriars, was concluded yesterday. No clue to the man had been obtained. Expert evidence showed that death had been caused by strychnia poison, and the jury could only find to that effect; there being nothing to show how the poison had been administered.

In the Queen's Bench Division yesterday, Mr. Justice Collins and a jury dealt with an action for libel brought by Mr. E. St. John Brenon, a journalist, against Mr. Harold Frederic. Both parties had been members of the Savage Club, where differences arose between them, and the matter complained of was contained in a report of what took place at a dinner given by members of the club to the defendant. The plaintiff claimed 1,000l. On hearing the facts the jury awarded him 50l.

Mrs. Brooks, a dressmaker carrying on business in the Edgware-road, obtained a verdict for 125l. against the Metropolitan Railway Company in the Queen's Bench Division yesterday, as compensation for injuries which she sustained in a collision when travelling on the defendants' line between Edgware-road and Swiss Cottage.

On Saturday, May 7, The House of Lords held only a formal sitting yesterday.

In the Commons, at the morning sitting, the Evidence in Criminal Cases Bill was referred to the Standing Committee on Law, on the understanding that, if the measure were passed this session, Ireland should be excluded from it. The Indian Councils Bill passed through Committee, and progress was made with the Burg Police and Health (Scotland) Bill and other measures. The House, on reassembling at nine o'clock, was counted out.

Lord Salisbury presided yesterday at a general meeting of the Primrose League in the Opera House, Covent Garden. In the course of his address he said that to the Protestant population of Ulster the conviction of their danger seemed to increase with every year, and he knew of nothing more unfortunate, no symptom more menacing, than the opinions lately put forward by the Ulster leaders. The conditions under which Ulster would have to struggle, if the proposed change should take place, appeared more clearly every day. He denied in this connection attacking the Roman Catholics, because he utterly declined to recognise the inhabitants of the south-eastern portion of Ireland as typical members of that body. The Ulster people knew the fight which was in store for them, and were prepared to meet it. For his own part, he would not accept the doctrine of unlimited submission and passive obedience which flowed from orthodox Liberal lips. The title both of kings and of Parliaments to the obedience of their subjects was that they should observe the fundamental understanding or compacts by which they ruled. Thus Parliament had a right to govern the people of Ulster, but not to sell them into slavery. It was quite possible for Parliament, like kings, to take a course which, while it was within the technical limits of its attribution, was yet entirely at variance with the understanding of the Constitution by which it ruled.

The Select Committee of the House of Commons on the Bill empowering the London County Council to construct a tramway over Westminster-bridge and along part of the Embankment, yesterday passed the preamble, the point of terminus to be upon the Embankment, at the outlet of the new Horse Guards avenue.

Yesterday Lord Knutsford, as Secretary of State for the Colonies, received an influential deputation, who desired that Queensland should be divided into three colonies—North, Central, and Southern—each to have a separate Government. Knutsford, in reply, pointed out that the Queensland Legislature had not yet passed a measure for three States in Federal union that was before it, and the question was hardly ripe for the consideration of the Imperial Parliament. Personally, he would like to see three Provincial Parliaments in North, Central, and Southern Queensland, and one Central Legislature. In that way this great colony would stand in a stronger position.

Lord Stalbridge presided last evening, at the Hotel Metropole, at the annual festival of the Railway Benevolent Institution, when over 9,000l. were subscribed in aid of the funds of the charity.

Upon the occasion of his tenth birthday yesterday, Crown Prince William of Prussia was received into the First Regiment of the Guards, in accordance with ancient custom in the House of Hohenzollern.

A Madrid correspondent telegraphs that the negotiations between Great Britain and Spain for the conclusion of a commercial treaty have been broken off. Spain declines to give the 'most-favoured-nations' treatment to England.

Charges of grave neglect are brought against the management of the St. Louis Hospital in Paris, where the two victims of the anarchist outrage at the Café Véry have been lying. It is asserted that the two injured men were left for many hours after their arrival at the treatment of students, and that it was owing to want of attention that the cases took so dangerous a turn. A correspondent, who gives the above statements as those of a Paris paper adds that the matter is to be brought

before the Municipal Council, which has control of the hospital.

Sussex were unable to make more than 48 runs in their second innings at Lord's and the M. C. C. and Ground consequently won the match by 70 runs. At Cambridge, Mr. Gay's side won the Seniors' match by nine wickets. In the Oxford Freshmen's match Mr. Berkeley's side completed an innings for 255, and, being 87 behind Mr. Palairet's side, will have to follow on.

Baron de Hirsch secured the One Thousand Guinea Stakes at Newmarket yesterday with La Fleche, The Smew being second, and Adoration third. The May Plate went to the Duke of Portland's Simony II, the Two-Year-Old Selling Plate to Mr. Chaloner's Duke of Berwick, the Fourth Welter Handicap to Lord Ellesmere's Lower Boy, the Two-Year-Old Selling Stakes to Mr. Rose's Narcissa filly, and the Breyby Plate to Mr. Singer's Arise.

It is stated that although Orme was not out yesterday his condition continued to improve.

The trial of Messrs. D. J. Nicol and C. W. Mowbray, indicted for having in The Commonwealth encouraged persons unknown to murder the Home Secretary, Mr. Justice Hawkins, and Police Inspector Melville, took place at the Central Criminal Court yesterday, before the Lord Chief Justice. There was a second indictment against Nicol for language he used in Hyde Park. Both prisoners pleaded 'Not guilty,' and Nicol defended himself. In the end Nicol was found guilty, and sentenced to eighteen months' hard labour, Mowbray being discharged.

Ellen Jane Clark, the woman who is charged with the manslaughter of her stepdaughter under shocking circumstances was brought up at the West London Police-court yesterday and demanded. The magistrate said he should certify that it was a case for the Treasury to take up.

THE MUSICAL AND DRAMATIC EXHIBITION IN VIENNA.

VIENNA, MAY 5. The Musical and Dramatic Exhibition was to-day open to the Press. There has never been in Vienna an exhibition at which there was so much to see. One afternoon is altogether insufficient for even a flying visit. The Ethnographical Collection occupies the transept at the southern or chief entrance gate beyond the Rotunda. In the opposite transept there is a collection of requisites from the Burg Theatre, Gothic windows with stained glass, picturesque tapestry, sedan chairs, curiosities, oak furniture, costly embroideries and draperies, and a thousand rare and beautiful objects that catch the eye and bewilder us, until we come to examine them more closely, and find that paste and cardboard, gold and silver foil, and paint are what they are composed of. This department will, no doubt, be the great attraction to the public. Of the two interiors, which are placed on balconies round the Rotunda, only a few are finished. Each is either the room of a famous composer, or the illustration of some popular song or scene. The Russian theatre, in quaint, almost barbarian, style, is also nearly finished.

The rest, indeed almost the whole exhibition, is at present chaos. The Italian Section is a good exception to the rule, being complete, so that the Emperor might view it to-morrow. The Italians have been most generous in lending objects of unsurpassed value. The fine old codici and missals from the Milan Library, from Church libraries and Government collections have been sent—unique works that seem reckless to put in such a dangerous place. Last night a spark fell upon some draperies in this section, and, though it was easily extinguished, it suggests the danger to which valuable works are exposed. There is one very interesting little room in the Italian Section. It is entirely devoted to the memory of Donizetti, whose life-size portrait hangs on the wall over the bedstead of wood and brass in which he breathed his last. His arm chair is there also, and his piano, upon which a touching inscription on a brass plate expresses the composer's last wishes with regard to the instrument which witnessed his hopes and disappointments, his solitary hours and his honours. He hopes his daughter will never sell it, at any price. These and a hundred other relics of Donizetti are exhibited by their owner, Baron Scotti di Bergamo, whose grandmother gave Donizetti the means of devoting himself to art. The firm of Ricordi, in Milan, has exhibited the manuscript scores of all the famous operas it has published, from Paisiello and Cimarosa down to the modern masters. The Scala Theatre of Milan, has exhibited over a thousand water colour drawings of single parts in operas and ballets, which are little masterpieces of bold originality. If all the special exhibits are as interesting as those in the Italian Section, the Rotunda ought to attract large numbers of lovers of musical and theatrical lore.
