-- Amongst the passengers leav-ing for Europe by the «Wittskind» yesterday was Mr. Charles A Catlin, for some time manager in the River Plate of the Pearce Artesian Well Company, but more gener-ally known as «Stand by O'Gorman» the telegraphic correspond-ent and versatile contributor of the Buenos Aires Standard, Although Mr. Catlin's views of Uruguayan atfairs differed con-siderably from our own and were by no means those generally held

in English speaking circles here, his ability and energy were un-deniable and our contemporary will not find it easy to replace him, for genuine journalistic talent is not easy to find in these latitudes We may mention that we ourselves have more than once been indebted to Mr. Catlin for acts o' journalistic courtesy and disinterested kindness even whilst we were attacking his views in our columns. We believe that he has no intention of returning to the River Plate, but we cannot let him depart without an expression of our good wishes for his future career, wherever it may be

placed. What, by the bye, is the origin - What, by the bye, is the origin and meaning of the pseudonym «Stand-by O'Gorman,» which, if we mistake not, has been worn by a succession of correspondents of the Standard? We call upon the Standard to explain for the benefit of the younger generation to whom the origin of its venerable jokes are lost in the mists of remote antilost in the mists of remote anti-quity. Why «O'Gorman,» and above all why «Stand by» which is neither surname nor Christian?

For the last few days the public have again been plagued by the issue of bogus bulletins. The nuisance is one against which the police ought to take more vigorous measures. Not only are the public defrauded of their conners, but the unscruppious coppers, but the unscrupulous falsehoods published in these bulletins sometimes do real mischief in these times of acute poli-tical agitation, whilst they also serve to bring into discredit the genuine bulletins of responsible papers. It is not the first time we have had to complain of these bogus bulletins, and the complaint is also made by our native contemporaries.

Our Buenos Aires contemporaries seem to labour under the delusion that the proclamation of Sr. that he is only 70 years of age. 


