The Planet Saturn.

Saturn, with its lovely ring and eight satellites, was regarded by Sir William Herschel as one of the celestia objects which alone make the science of astronomy worth studying. Saturn is the second of the so called Giant Planets, but it is smaller than Jupiter, and is moreover conspicuously spheroidal, even more so than its rival. Its equatorial diameter is 74,000 miles whilst its polar axis is only 68,000 miles. The distance of the planet from the central lummary is double than of Jupiter, being \$20,000,000 of miles at peribelion, its nearest approach to the Sun, and receding to 950,000,000 of miles at aphelion, and thus it will be seen the orbit, or path of Saturn round the Sun, is considerably elliptical in shape. 


