LONDON NOTES

WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 5.

A Malta Correspondent telegraphs that the P. and O. transport Nubia, which arrived there from Bombay yesterday has been intercepted on her way home, and will at once take on board the Seaforth Highlanders for conveyance to Egypt. The liner will call on the way at Cyprus to embark further reinforcements.
Last night a detachment of the Lincolnshire Regiment left Cairo to join the Anglo Egyptian forces at the front. Other troops leave on Friday, and more will follow as soon as transport is available. General Gatacre has been appointed to the command of the British troops to operate against the Derwishes, and will leave England to-day.

A terrible accident by which 22 lives were lost and more than a hundred persons injured, is reported from London, Ontario. While the successful candidates at the municipal elections were addressing a meeting at the City Hall, the platform and part of the flooring subsided, and 200 persons were thrown into a cellar below. The victims include many of the best known men in the town. The cause of the disaster was the giving way of a beam running the whole length of the hall beneath the flooring.
There was a large assembly of spectators at St. Peter's, Eaton square yesterday to witness the marriage of Prince Victor Dhuleep Singh, elder son of the late Maharajah Dhuleep Singh, to Lady Anne Coventry, younger daughter of the Earl of Coventry.

The death of Sir Edward Augustus Bond, late Principal Librarian of the British Museum, is announced. The deceased gentleman passed away on Sunday, at his residence in Prince's square, Bayswater, the day after the announcement of his promotion to a Knight Commandership of the Bath.

Details of interesting wills are published this morning. The personal estate of the late Sir John Gilbert has been sworn at 231,584l. and that of the late Baron Pollock at 12,385l.

Respecting the forty eight hour demand in the engineering trade a Manchester Correspondent states that two A.S.E. officials have informed him that the provincial members do not desire any reduction in the hours of labour, and that they regard the suggestion to accept the employers' terms in return for reduced hours as entirely opposed to the desires of the men. Further negotiations were carried on yesterday by representatives of the allied trades and a leading member of the Employers' Federation, but no definite settlement was arrived at owing, it was stated, to the difficulty of arranging the financial terms under which the reduction in the hours should be effected.

In the course of his presidential address to the Miners' Federation of Great Britain, which commenced its annual Conference at Bristol yesterday, Mr. B. P. Pickard, M. P. ridiculed the assertion he had heard made, that trade unions were worn out. At the same time he contended that they were of little good unless they were of an aggressive and determined character. One object lesson furnished by the engineers' dispute was that it was practically useless to endeavour to obtain the eight hours day by direct conflict with the employers, and that the method of the miners, that of going for the concession by legislation, was the best.
The Incorporated Society of Musicians opened their thirteenth annual conference yesterday, meeting in the morning in the Mansion House, where they were welcomed by the Lord Mayor, and in the afternoon at the Hotel Cecil. There was a large attendance. The chief item in the morning was the opening address by Sir J. Stainer, who deplored the multiplication of imperfectly qualified teachers of music. In the afternoon Mr. J. Seymour (Dublin) described the musical revival begun in Ireland eight months ago by the new society called the Feis Ceoil.

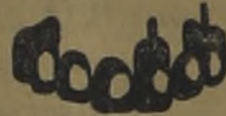

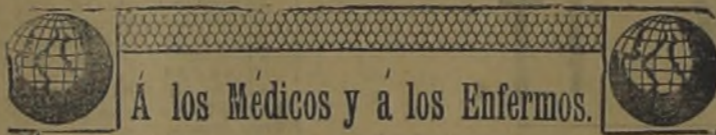
