The Decree of the Executive for the better regulation of political meetings has produced a good ef-fect, and in view of the recent dis-creditable disorders no one can think it too stringent Yes-terday's Siglo, commenting on these and on the apparent recrudescence of «collectivism» in the capital, attributes both to the delay in producing the electoral accord - We do not entirely see the connection and think it would be more correct to attribute them to the lax manner and wantof precau-tions with which the meetings are held. At this rate, a single group of men might soon dominate every club in the Department. At Colon, for instance, the meeting was swamped with «colo-rados», real or pretended, from Mon-tevideo, who had no business there at all, and at the disorderly meeting of the 7th Section on Monday the large majority of those present were not residents of the district; besides, the sectional Committee of that district had already been elected and the meeting was merely an impudent face. Library.

The latest number of Macmillan's Colonial Library has reached us in the shape of Thomas Hardy's «The Well Beloved,» a novel that has already become popular in other editions. In this book the great novelist shows himself entirely in a lighter mood, avoiding the «problems» of his two previous works. The central figure of «The Well-Beloved» is that of a man who is constantly pursuing a femin-ine ideal, which he finds, or imagines that he finds, embodied from lime to time in various women that he meets, though unfortunately it is apt to change lodgings rather suddenly, and thus, while his ideal mains the same, the recipients of his attentions vary with amazing rapidity. This ingenious and original idea is worked out by Mr, Hardy in such fashion that his hero is successively in love with mother, daughter and grand-daughter, to say noth-ing of amorous escapades-of a harmleas character - between whiles. The story is told with a delicate touch of comedy and in Mr. Hardy's usual brilliant style, and Hardy's usual brittant style, and affords very pleasant reading. We have also to acknowledge the receipt from Messrs. Macmill-an and Co. of their triplet of Maga-zines for March. The *Century* is zines for March. The Century is an unusually powerful number. The Washington and New York telegrams, however, state that the mediation has been categorically refused by Mr. McKieley. Then appears a latter McKinley. Then appears a latter Rome telegram stating that, in spite of this refusal the Pope is con-tinuing his efforts to bring the quar-rel to arbitration, and that he is trying to resuscitate the European Concert (which played such a sorry part in the Armenian question) in order that it may exert its influence on the two Powers. Not much success is augured for this, howsuccess is augured for this, how-ever, and it is said that Great Britain has already declined to form part of the Concert for such a purpose. Howaver, it is difficult to judge what is really passing as the telegrams are full of contradictions and obvious inventions. Among the latobvious inventions. Among the latter is the tale that the New York Life Insurance Company has offered a loan of ten million dollars to the U.S. Government.

-No less contradictory and con-fusing are the telegrams concern-ing Mr. McKinley's Message, which was to have been sent to Congress yesterday. Some of these contain quite lengthy forecasts of the Message, and even make out that there are two Messages, one pacific, the other bellicose. These are all quietly set aside by a Washington telegram saying that all these premature versions have been denied by a semi-official note, adding that President McKin-lay, in view of the conflict of opinions prevalent, will confine himself to submitting the questions of Cuba and the «Maine» to Con-gress, without recommending any course of action. The only thing remaining certain in the whole business is that the preparations for war continue with the greatest activity on both sides.

-There will be no papers pubbished here for the next few days, but it is certain that bulletins will appear if any important or decisive news arrives. We warn the public, however, against being misled by bogus bulletins.

-As we anticipated, the very heavy rains of Tuesday produced se-rious innundations in various parts of the city and suburbs, and the damage to property has been con-siderable. The policy and local authorities were busy all the afternoon and evening assisting those whose houses were flooded. BUENOS AIRES.

- On Sunday a special train took a number of gentlemen who had been invited by Mr. Vicente L. Ca-sares to witness the inauguration of his new butter-factory, La Martona. It is now some years since Mr. Casares started the making of butter and cheese; and the neat, clean, shops of La Martona where fresh milk can always be had, have long been a feature of the city. There are now as many as 23 of them, all doing a thriving trade. Mr. Casares' new establishment will turn out as much as 5000 kilos of butter daily. There are 1800 cows milk-ed every day, and the milk of 3000 cows in the surroundings is purchased by the establishment. Durof milk were used. The following shows the increase in the manufacture of butter: in 1891, 8000 kilos; in '92, 82000; '93, 360,000; '94, 460,000; '95, 760,000; '96, 1,480,-000; '97, 1,700,000, half of which was exported. This is evidently a national industry which is assuming great proportions without any state interference or other noxious and unnatural aids.

In the House of Lords, the London University Commission Bill passed through Committee, and the Evid-ence in Criminal Cases Bill-permitting accused persons to enter the witness box if they desired it and to deny charges brought against them on oath-was read a second time.

An important announcement was made by Mr. Curzon in the House of Commons with respect to rumours affecting the Far East. Russia was negotiating for a lease for a certain number of years of Port Arthur and Talienwan, as well as for the construction of a railway to one or other of these places on the same conditions as the Manchuria Eailway. No de-mand for sovereign rights over these ports had been made, and if leased they would be open to foreign trade like other ports. No information had been received confirming the alleged concession of

Mr. Goschen, on moving the House into Committee of Supply on the Navy Estimates, remarked that he had to ask for a colosal sum-amounting to over 23.3/4 millions. Germany N. York Italy Spain Brastl Rumors were current at Washington yesterday, and were re-peated in connection with Cuba, to the effect that an alliance had been formed between Great Britain and the United States. The State De-partment, however, denied that there was any foundation for these statements. On the other hand, a Washington Correspondent notices that the feeling with regard to Great Britain in the United States is fast turning in her favour, and that the opinion is expressed that a rapproachment should be sought with her rather than with any other State.

The Czar in a rescript addressed to the Minister of Finance, instructs him to disburse the sum of ninety million roubles, or about nine and a half millions sterling, for the needs of naval construction. The expenditure will be met without the need of raising a loan.

Order had yesterday been restor-ed in Bombay. Besides the two privates of the Shropshire Re-giment killed on Wednesday, Mr. Dawes, a plague inspector, was accidentally shot.




