THE NATURALISATION OF FOREIGNERS.

The stage which the discussion of this question has reached in our native contemporaries may be judged by the following remarks

in the Siglo of yesterday: —

«We are all agreed in recognising that it is highly convenient that foreigners should be incorporated. n our administrative and political life, as they are already incor-porated in our economical life, which owes immense pro-gresses to their capital and their labor. But the harmony of views disappears when we descend from general lines to details and endeayour to establish a practical procedure for the carrying out of such incorporation. The doctrine of obli gatory cuizenship has enthusiastic gatory citizenship has enthusiastic partisans... But the present state of the country does not lend itself to an experiment in obligatory citizenship. We would run a serious risk of remaining without foreign residents by too great haste in increasing the number of citizens before we have acquired the necessary political stability. necessary political stability. So long as we still have to impart stability to our institutions and solidly establish individual guarantees, so long as there is a lear of a renewal of internal struggles, so long as the pressing of men to recruit the army and police s not definitely abolished, and so ong as the law does not prevail in all its integrity over the caprices of high functionaries and of local petty chieftains (cacequillos,) the op portunity has not yet arrived to impose citizenship on the foreigner who lives amongst us under the protection of his Minister or his Consul. For the moment all that can be done is to facilitate the acquisition of legal citizenship by those foreigners who, fulfilling the conditions of Article 8 of the Constitution, spontaneously desire to intervene in our political af-fairs, by means of the suffrage and of our institutional mechan-ism. Various sociological factors affect the naturalisation of foreign-ers, and consequently it would be absurd to suppose that the apathy which we sli lament at present can be transformed by a simple legisbe transformed, by a simple legislative reform, into an enthusiastic movement in favor of naturalisation. According to data recently published, the letters of citizenship is sued from 1852 to 1887 only number 409, giving for the thirty-six years a wretched average of one per month. The procedure exact ed for the acquisition of citizenship may make more or less easy or difficult the action of the foreigner who has already decided on such a step, but it is not suffi-cient to determine the step itself,

Clasped Hands.

How, asks an American paper,

do you interlace your fingers in clasping your hands? Clasp them now. Don't stop to do it with intent. Clasp them. How do you do it? LONDON NOTES

THURSDAY, APRIL 14.

At Washington yesterday for the greater part of the day war was regarded as certain within a few hours. Later, however, when the sense of the Resolution agreed upon by the Foreign Relations Committee of the Lower House was published it was found to be less extreme than had been anticipated. While it directs the President to restore peace in Cuba at once, it merely «authorizes» and «empowers» him to use for that purpose the military and naval forces, and thus leaves recourse to arms to his discretion. The Senate Committee's resolutions were more outspokenly warlike in view. Discussion upon them was held over until to-day. In the meantime, however, Mr. Hale has introduced a substitute substantially reproducing the form adopted by the House. This is believed to be favoured by Mr. McKinley, and, if this is so, it is likely to pass the Senate. A Correspondent remarks that, while the terms decided upon by the Committee of the Lower House are less openly offensive to Spain than the Resolution reported or six weeks voyage There is no confirmation of the resignation of Sr. Sagasta's Cabinet, but its reconstruction is expected.

If they had decided to do so they should have given Rus-sia timely notice. That would have been an intelligible policy. Instead of taking the line that they would resist Russia having this port they might have said it was inevitable. Yesterday the Good Templars continued their Conference at Ply-

mouth. Satisfaction was expressed at the results of the late Country Council and School Board elections and at the return of many men pledged to a continuance of temper-ance work on these bodies. It was stated that over 600 Good Templars occupied public offices throughout the country.

The wage earned by the colliers is variously estimated at from 18 to 35 shillings a week. A number of non-associated collieries have granted their men an advance, and are working at high pressure. Meetings held yesterday showed a disinclusation on the part of the workmen to grant to their representatives that plenary power which the employers insist upon their possessing before they enter into conference.




