So do scientific fiction and fictitious science go hand in hand.

Ninety Miles an Hour.
The Diamond Jubilee year was not to close without a notable advance in railway speed, writes Mr. Rous-Marten, in the "Engineering Magazine." Mr. S. W. Johnson brought out on the Midland Railway five new single wheel express engines of singularly fine proportions and handsome appearance. They have inside cylinders 19 1/2 by 26, 170 pounds' steam pressure, and single drivers no less than 7ft 9in in diameter—the largest wheels ever employed with inside cylinders on a gauge of 4ft 8 1/2 in. With these superb locomotives I made several special speed trials without breaking the record. But finally, testing one of these engines with a load of 150 tons down a long grade, sixteen miles, mostly at 1 in 200, I obtained the following remarkable figures for five successive quarter-miles: 10.2 seconds, 10 seconds, 10 seconds, 10 seconds, 10.2 seconds. Thus the engine ran for three-quarters mile at the rate of exactly ninety miles an hour, the speed for the whole mile being 89.5. Unfortunately, after the third quarter-mile, which was done in 10 seconds, a rising gradient was encountered, which steadily lowered the rate. Had the falling grade continued a little longer, or had it been somewhat steeper, I see no reason to doubt that even a slightly higher velocity might have been reached.

LONDON NOTES

FRIDAY, APRIL 8. Telegrams from Madrid and Washington yesterday did not confirm the hopeful views with regard to the Spanish-American dispute founded on the report that Spain was about to yield.

Yesterday, the Ambassadors at Washington of the six Great Powers called by appointment at the White House, where Sir Julian Pauncefote presented to the President, on his own behalf and that of his colleagues in the name of their respective Governments, a note embodying a pressing appeal to the feelings of humanity and moderation of the President, and the American people in their existing differences with Spain.

A conference was held at Cardiff yesterday, composed of delegates representing over 100,000 men, or practically the whole of the miners employed in the South Wales coal field.

Details of the wreck of the West African mail steamer Dahomey on the rocks off Holyhead are known. The ship, which was outward bound from the Mersey, went aground in a dense fog, and notwithstanding the difficulties of the situation the passengers, mails, and crew were saved.

Further detachments of Volunteers left London yesterday to take part in the Eastern Manoeuvres. At Lord's, the Gentlemen v. Players match has been arranged for July 18, the day on which Dr. W. G. Grace will complete his 50th year.

Fines amounting in all to 120l., with the alternative of three months' imprisonment, were imposed at the North London Police-court yesterday, on William Masterman, proprietor of a cricket-field, at St Ann's-road, South Tottenham. Evidence was given which went to show that the field was used as a place for illicit drinking on a Sunday morning, a large shed which stood in it being fitted up as a public house.
