LONDON NOTES

FRIDAY, APRIL 8. Telegrams from Madrid and Washington yesterday did not confirm the hopeful views with regard to the Spanish-American dispute founded on the report that Spain was about to yield. At the Cabinet Council at Madrid on Wed-nesday night it was decided to adhere to the position already taken up, and that decision has been communicated to the Washington Government as well as to the Pope, who had inquired what concessions Spain would be willied. cessions Spain would be willing to make. Contrary to expectation no notice was published yesterday of the armistice to the insurgents. The negotiations between the two Governments are now in abeyance, and, it is stated from Washington, will not be resumed without the re-

will not be resumed without the request of the Spanish Cabinet.
Yesterday, the Ambassadors at Washington of the six Great Powers called by appointment at the White House, where Sir Julian Pauncefote presented to the President, on his own behalf and that of his colleagues in the name of of his colleagues in the name of their respective Governments, a note embodying a pressing appeal to the feelings of humanity and moderation of the President, and the American people in their existing differences with Spain, and expressing the hope that the nego-tiations might have a peaceable issue. Mr. McKinley replied that the Government of the United States recognised the Igoodwill which prompted the appeal.
