

Although the methods used for measuring the memory may have been crude, as they still are, it is nevertheless a great advance to be made to measure but one kind of memory, the direct faculty of acquisition. The same pro-cess is gone through on the other side. Thus eight positions have been assumed and a large number of muscles used. If sleep has not been induced the same cycle is gone over again, -Lancet.

The Drink of Natious

Why men drink alcohol, whether for good, bad, foolish or vicious reasons, is a question about which we shall perhaps never be able to agree. But what they drink-a matter of extreme interest at this convivial season - we are enabled to answer by means of a careful to alcoholic memorandum as beverages, the production and con-sumption of beer, wine, and spirits in the chief European countries and in the United States, prepared by Mr. Bateman, the head of the Commercial Department of the Board of Trade. One fact clearly emerges from the returns. There is much talk of wine, but it is in reality an insignificant element of consumption in most countries; and there is no reason to think that the drinking of it is greatly increasing. To all appearance the future, even in the sunny south, belongs to beer and spirits, in 1895 there was not half-a-gallon of wine per head drunk in the United Kingdom; the quantity was less in the United States; it was in Ger

A state of siege has been declared and the city placed under marital law. The residences of the Ministers have to be guarded from assault. The downfall of the Liberal Cabinet is considered inevitable, and there is talk of forming a National Cabinet of Defence selected from the leaders of all parties.



Monsignor Ireland at Washington, and the Papal Nuncio at Madrid, had been instructed to express the Pontiff's ardent desire that the close of the century might not be marred by further bloodshed, and action had also been taken to influence other Powers to add their efforts towards the maintenance of peace, but be-yond this all that Leo XIII, has been able to do is to induce Spain to offer the insurgents an armistice. instead of waiting to be petitioned by them.
