A VIPER KILLED BY A THUNDERBOLT.

For some little time insidious rumors have been in circulation which could not but be viewed with alarm by all the supporters of the political revolution that has taken place under Sr. Cuestas' Govern ment. It was said that there was to be «reconciliation» with the dethroned «collectivity», that the Cabinet was to be reformed on a less po pular basis, that there had been a approchement between Sr. Cuestas and the leaders of the «collectivity» which would lead to the political reinstatement of the latter, and so forth.

Fortunately, all these rumors are set at rest and the political atmos phere greatly cleared by the follow ing opportune and sturdy declaration which has been officially furnished to the press by the President's Secretary: -

We are authorised by the Pro-visional President to make the following declarations:

«The news circulated by certain papers of rapprochement between «collectivism» and the present political situation, proceed from false sources, for Sr. Cuestas' Government marches steadily and perseveringly towards the goal in aim since its beginning, for the good of public interests, and has no hand in manœuvres likely to discredit

«Once for all, both friends and adversaries may know that the Government does not fraternise nor compromise with the discredited

elements of the country.

Sr Cuestas Government supports itself on public opinion, reecting everything dangerous to honorable proceedings, a course which will not be abandoned, whatever may occur.

«All the tales respecting the change of Cabinet and of civil and military chiefs that without exception merit the confidence of the government, are likewise false, and bave no other object than intri-gue and treachery. All who are interested in peace and order should confide in the Government, which has already given its friends proofs of firmness, rectitude, loyal-ty and consistency.*

GENERAL ROCA.

The Argentine presidential election took place on Sunday, amid a minimum of interest, and with the foresen result that General Roca was elected President of the Republic, for a second term of office, without opposition of consequence. He will assume office on October 12th. It is difficult to know whether or

not to congratulate Argentina on the result of the election General Roca is strongs man, perhaps the only man in the Republic capable of keeping under control the diverse political elements of which it is constituted, but he has always seemed to us more of a party politician than of a national statesman. His first presidency was not bad, but neither was it so good as to render a second experiment imperative, and it would certainly be untrue to say that he left office with an immaculate or even a very popular character. There was an unusual amount of material progress in the Republic during his term, but that was incidental rather than directly attributable to any action of his. It must never be forgotten that he gave the Republic forced currency-after protesting that he would cut off his extension of the use of cheques, right hand sooner than sign the decree-and he gave it and made market.

possible Juarez Celman, and two greater evils could not be imagined. If not personally corrupt, he winked at a vast deal of cor-ruption around bim and, like many other South American politi cians, did not hesitate to employ corruption as a legitimate political weapon. In fact, he made little or no effort to implant either political, electoral or administrative purity

in the Republic. In energy, influence, decision and taleut for political intrigue he is much above the present president Uriburu and his predecessor Dr. Saenz Peña, and he is much below them in integrity of purpose and of character. Worst of all it is said that he is the leader of the party in favor of a war with Chili over the boundary question-a war the most unreasonable, iniquitous and unnecessary that ever was conceived, and one that would alienate the Republic from all European sympathy and injure its welfare and retard its progress in every direction. On the whole, then, we think there is very little to congratulate Argentina upon. We will not say that General Roca is a bad choice, but we do think it shows a

remarkable poverty among its pub-lic men and leading politicians, that a very much better man and one far more suited to the present situation could not be found. If he is the best, it speaks poorly for the rest. If he had spent half the time since his last presidency, enlarging his mind by a trip to Europe, England and the United States, to see how the

All other branches of the company's business were similarly affected, the revenue from the dock, workshops, tug. &c. falling below one-half that of 1896. LONDON NOTES

SATURDAY, MAY 14.

The presence of the Spanish Cape Verde fleet in West Indian waters is confirmed. It appears that two steamers laden with coal were sent to Martinique to meet the fleet which is now supposed to be making for Havana to raise the blockade, Admiral Sampson's fleet has left San Juan in search of the Spaniards, and the Flying Squad-ron under Commodore Schley sailed from Fort Monroe yester day with sealed orders. The news has caused considerable excitement both in Madrid and Washing-

Early on Thursday morning Admiral Sampson bombarded San Juan, Puerto Rico, for three hours. The forts were damaged, but not silenced. One man was killed on the American side and two on the

Spanish. Several were wounded.
Further fighting has taken place
at Naples between the rioters and
the troops. Numbers were killed
and wounded. While the disorders
were at their height, a mutiny broke out in the prison, and had to be suppressed by the military. A Rome Correspondent states that great uneasiness is felt there, an outbreak of violence being feared, Yesterday troops were stationed at the University with orders to arrest students who attempted to assemble. At Milan order has been completely restored. It is believed that the re-cent events will bring about the downfall of the Cabinet. Among the possible successors of the Rudini Cabinet are Baron Son-nino and Signor Giolitti.






