POLITICAL NOTES.

The most important news of the day is that the Message referring to the Port of Montevideo was sign on Friday afternoon and forwarded to the Council of State. No doubt the text will be published in due time The Message has been drafted by the Minister of Foment Sr. Varela, as also the explanation of the Port plans. The financial part is due to the Minister of Finance, Dr. Ramon Mendoza, and proposes, as we understand, to raise the necessary capital by means of an internal loan emitted in annual series.

The Council of State no-quorum-

ed on Friday. The Siglo, com menting on this, takes the oppor tunity of pointing out that the dis-cussion in detail of the Law of Electoral Reform has already spread over two weeks and only 25 Articles out of 83 have been sanctioned. At this rate the Law will not be completed until the middle of August, and mean-while there are such important matters as the Budget, the annual tributary Laws and the Port question, to say nothing of minor measures, awaiting the attention of the Council. The Siglo attributes the loss of time to two causes; first, that the Council is taking the law in a captious spirit, showing a tendency to run into an excess of petty detail which will only make the Law intricate, cumbersome and vexatious in practice, as indeed is already proving the case with the Law of Civic.

Another despatch raises the number of ves sels to 22 Three of the vessels carry troops. The Minister of carry troops. The Minister of Marine is on board the «Colon.» The cause of the delay was said to be the trial of a new

through the Straits of Gibraltar and divided into two in the Mediterranean, which would show it to be bound for Manila (about four weeks voyage) but this requires confirmation. It seems uncertain whether Admiral Authon is still on board or has already returned to Spain, but it is said he is already preparing a third squad-ron (with what elements?) There is also serious news from

Manila. The Tagalos have made another attack on the city capturing some of the outer fortifications and driving the Spanish forces back to the inner intrenchments. They have also possession of the aqueduct which supplies the city with water. They have now over 3000 Spanish officers and soldiers as prisoners, who are well treated except when they offer resistance. The garrison is said to be very short of provisions. There is a rumor, requiring confirmation, that the Governor General Agusti has resigned his post in favor of the second in command. An utterly incomprehensible telegram states that three war vessels flying the flag of the Phillipine Republic (!!!) have entered the bay and are bombarding Manila. Telegraph-ing from Cavite on the 12th. Admiral Dewey says that the sanitary condition of his squad ron is excellent. There were then in the bay three German war vessels, two British, one French and one Japanese and another German was expected. The exact list of Spanish vessels lost was 2 protected cruisers, 5 unprotected cruisers, 1 armed transport and 1 armed service boat, destroyed; the transport Manila and the gun

boat Callao captured.
It is now stated that the reason of the Spanish Government for refusing to exchange the prisoners of the Merrimac is that Lieut. Hobson and his companious are in the Morro fortress, which there-fore will not be shelled so long as they are there. (According to some accounts the Morro fortress is already destroyed)

The bombardment of Santiago was renewed on Thursday or Friday morning (or both) and it is said orders have been given for it to be continued daily until further notice. It is said further considerable damage was done to the fortifications with some loss of life on the Spanish side and none on the American, but the accounts are so confused that it is difficult to tell what to make of them. A shell from the Texas fell on a munition magazine causing terrible damage. The 1000 lb. shot from the Massachusetts also caused great damage,

ppening a breach in the walls.
Finally, there is a rumor from a French source that the Queen Regent had prepared her abdic ation in favor of the Infanta Isabel (sister of the late King and very popular in Spain) but was dissuaded from presenting it by Sr. Sagasta, holding it back for an other opportunity.

was moved by the Marquis of Salisbury, who spoke of Mr. Gladstone's as the most distinguished political name of the century. The Earl of Kimberley, the only Minister of the control of the control of the century. ter remaining who sat in all the Cabinets over which Mr. Gladstone presided, seconded the motion, presided, seconded the motion, which was also spoken to by the Duke of Devonshire and Lord Rosebery. Lord Rosebery drew a vivid picture of the universality and humanity of Mr. Gladstone's sympathies and the depth of his Christian faith. This country loved brave man, Mr. Gladstone was the said. men; Mr. Gladstone was, he said, the bravest of the brave. Reference was also made to the solitary and pathetic figure, who for sixty years, shared all the sorrows and all the jovs of Mr. Gladstone's life, and who, by her tender vigilance, sus-tained and prolonged his years.




