NEWS OF THE DAY

Saints Roman, Just and Pastor.—Holidays ended to day, 1890.—21 days past, 144 to the end of the year.

POLITICAL NOTES.

The most important event on Saturday was the assumption of his post by the new Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Dr. Mendiabaru. The ceremony was of the usual description. The attendance was mainly confined to Government officials.

The Decree has been issued naming Sr. Jose A. Ferreira (conservationalist) as Councilor of State in place of Dr. Gonzalo Ramirez.

A Decree has been issued from the Ministry of War creating, under the dependence of the Ministry, a Technical Office of Engineering, Marine and Artillery, whose duty it shall be to report to the Government on all points submitted to it in those branches.

There is, we are glad to say, a considerable decadence in the alarmist revolutionary rumors which so disturbed the public mind and depressed the market last week.

The precautions taken by the Government, and the reiterated assurances of our official and unofficial native contemporaries, are having their effect and convincing the people that no serious fear need be attached to any attempt the "collectivists" may make, if indeed, they ever get beyond mere talk. This was plainly seen on the Bolsa yesterday, where there was a decided recovery in business and prices. It is quite probable that Bolsa speculation had a great deal to do with the fall in prices last week.

Our contemporaries are again occupying themselves with the efforts for the «conciliation of the «corados party, a labor which seems to make but slow progress. For our part we cannot help thinking that the importance of the matter is being greatly overrated.

there should be no departure. It is for the men to conform to the programme, and not for the programme to be modelled to suit the men. If there are still «colorados» who are unable to give their support to the first honest, decent and reactionary «colorado» government that the Republic has had for many years, so much the worse for themselves and for the credit of their party. The Government can afford to do without the support of such men, and it should not go out of its way to seek it. If they choose to come to its side and aid its work, well and good, but it is not for the Government to change its policy on their account, so long as that policy is approved by general public opinion. At present there is only one motto possible for the Government in its task of regenerating and reconstructing the Republic, and that is «Honor and economy in administration, and war to the knife against the «collectivists» and all their ways.» That motto should be sufficient to gain the support of every honest man and true well-wisher of the country. As to those who cannot accept it, the Government is better without their aid.

In relation to the above, it is again said on several sides that the only terms on which General Villar will come into the «conciliation» are the granting of a certain number of seats in the future Chamber and a share in the Government to prominent «collectivists.» Such a proposition is frankly immoral and should not be entertained for an instant. General Villar's support, where he forty Generals, is not worth having at such a price, and if those are his ideas, he had better retire into private life or join his friends on the other side of the river.

Although the Cabinet has only just been reconstituted the Siglo is harping on the necessity for further changes, though that necessity is far from being proved. Why cannot it let well alone?

It is expected that Sr. Lefor Gallardo will be the new Prefect of Paysandu. It is to be hoped the selection will prove satisfactory this time.

Serj. Major Amen was brought to the capital a prisoner, from Canelones, on Saturday, having been arrested by direct order of the President. An order has been issued for the arrest of Col. Cabrera, also of Canelones. The reasons are believed to be political, that is to say connected with subversive manoeuvres.

A plan is attributed to the Executive to reconstitute the 2nd Chasseurs Regiment, recently dissolved on account of disaffection, employing for the purpose the men of the present Heavy Artillery Corps, which played such a prominent part in the recent mutiny, and which will be disbanded as an Artillery Regiment. Meantime a change of barracks is being effected between the latter and the 4th Chasseurs.

Football. Albion F. C. 2nd XI versus American F. C.—This match was played at Punta Carretas on Sunday, before about 1000 spectators, and resulted in another victory for the Albions by 2 goals to nil. Both teams played well. Lodge scored the first goal in the latter end of the first half, and Williams was responsible for the second towards the end of the game. J. Sardeson, Cardenal and Ferris played best for the losers, and for the winners Williams, Ramsay, Bordini and Lodge.

Argentine Trade Statistics. We have before us N° 98, report issued by the General Direction of Statistics of the Foreign Trade of the Argentine Republic. The imports during the first 6 months of this year were to the value of \$49,533,375 gold, besides \$1,446,617 in bullion and coin. This means a decrease of \$150,404 in goods and an increase of \$1,162,855 in coin compared with the corresponding season of last year. \$1,431,908 of the imports came from the United States, decrease \$553,748, and \$17,800,137 from the United Kingdom, decrease \$1,147,483. Italian goods show a great increase. The exports in the same period were \$31,632,825, an increase of \$17,593,292 besides \$105,054 specie, a decrease of \$1,075,240. It is satisfactory to see such a large superiority of exportation, both of goods and

specie over importation. Of the exports \$2,818,987 were to the United States, a decrease of \$2,408,778 and \$11,784,353 to the United Kingdom, an increase of \$4,183,029.—B. A. Herald.

THE WAR.

Though there is no official declaration yet, the telegrams seem to have fairly settled down to the conviction that Spain has accepted the terms of peace in general, and accordingly we may expect to hear of orders being given for the suspension of hostilities in a day or two. Indeed, according to one message, General Merrit has already been instructed to communicate the new situation to General Agusti and to restrain the Tagalos from further operations against Manila. There are some minor points which Spain desires to see altered, but it is not expected that these will give rise to trouble. To all intents and purposes the war may be regarded as over.

The U. S. forces in Puerto Rico have occupied the town of Guayama, after a slight skirmish with the Spanish troops in which there were a few wounded on either side. After having evacuated the place, the Spanish troops attempted an assault but speedily retired before the fire of the Zalinski gun. The inhabitants gave the U. S. forces an exceptionally enthusiastic welcome. The port of Fajardo, on the west of the island, and the surrounding district have also been occupied. The main body of the U. S. forces, under General Miles, are now in front of Juan Diaz. It is again reported that the Governor of San Juan has received instructions from his Government to surrender on the same terms as General Toral.

SUNDRIES.

—A warm «welcome on Changó» —to use the expression made classic by our contemporary the B. A. Standard—was extended yesterday to King Sol on his reappearance in the streets after a prolonged absence. He would have been still more appreciated if he had chosen Sunday for the event, instead of a working day.

The question whether knickerbockers and cycling shoes should be worn during office hours by clerks and officials is much discussed in Vienna just now. The «Neues Wiener Journal» has questioned some important office chiefs, the Governor of the Province among them. The answer has been negative as regards Government offices, and as regards commercial concerns affirmative, with the limitation that clerks and officials who come into contact with the public cannot be allowed to appear in cycling dress.

LONDON NOTES

SATURDAY, JULY 9. A telegram from Cairo states that Admiral Camara has informed the Egyptian Government that his squadron is returning to Spain. His vessels will now be allowed to coal.

In an interview, Lieutenant Hobson describes how he took the Merrimac into the channel at the entrance of Santiago Bay. He failed to block it up entirely, owing to the rudder having been destroyed by the Spanish fire. He was well treated by the Spaniards after the British Consul had insisted on the removal of the prisoners from Morro Castle.

The Chinese rebellion is reported to be spreading. Yung shien and Pulinshien have surrendered to the rebels, and Wu-chau and other places are threatened. The British gunboat Tweed has left Hong Kong for Wu-chau. A Berlin Correspondent learns that Prince Louis Napoleon is about to be betrothed to the Grand Duchess Helena, cousin of the Czar. There was an exceptionally large attendance in the House of Lords yesterday when Lord Strathcona moved the second reading of the Colonial Marriages (Deceased wife's Sister) Bill, a measure introduced to enable children of marriage with a deceased wife's sister to inherit property in this country. The rejection of the Bill was moved by the Lord Chancellor on the ground that it would alter the law of inheritance in Great

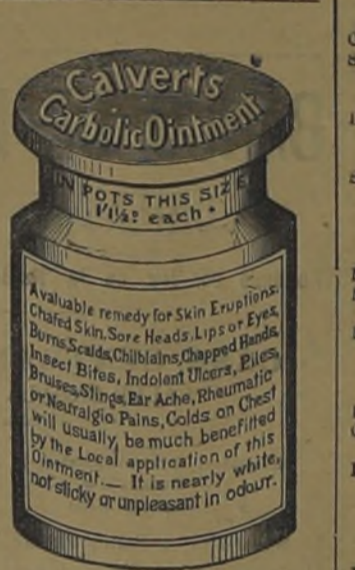
