These receipts are unprecedent edly high for what is generally one of the dullest months of the year, but unfortunately this fact cannot be attributed to any special business prosperity, for in truth business has been very depressed, but merely to the activity shown by importers to despatch such mer chandise as they had stored in the Custom House, before the restora tion of the 2 1/2 % extra Duty which came into force on August lst. This is shown by the high figures for importation, \$946,000 against \$583,000 last year and \$740,650 in 1896. Exportation, on the other hand, reached one of the lowest figures on record, hav ing been nearly at a stand-still during the month in still during the month. In 1897 it reached \$63,360 and in 1896 \$65,603 against the 29,648 of the present year these special circumstances it is impossible to take the figures as a guage of the state of business, and indeed it is very probable that the exceptionally high figures of July will be counterbalanced by low fig ures in the present menth of August. We may mention that the number of permits to despatch dur ing July reached the exceptional number of 5634, and that the above statement was drawn up with omission of 172 permits, represent-ing some \$30,000, which will be passed on to the August account. As an example of the special activity to anticipate the restoration of the 21/2 % extra Duty, we may men tion that the firm of Melzen Vincenti & Co. despatched no fewer than 4000 cases of Fernet Bitters, representing some \$16,000 in dut-

There was a comparative lull yesterday in the slarms of rumors and invasions. The game is getting rather played out. The rumors have already referred to nearly every possible corner of the Republic as the scene of the uprising, and each time equally without foundation, and there will soon be left no ground for them to work upon -unless they commence the round afresh.

As if the perpetual rumors of conspiracies and invasions were not sufficient to keep the public mind uneasy, it is daily becoming more evident that there is a powerful political intrigue affoat, the ob-ject of which is to eliminate the presidential candidature of Sr. Cuestas, though in favor of whom is not yet clear, nor is it easy to imagine what better candidate for the present situation could be brought forward. A rather absurd charge has been public-ly made - the Nacion repeat ed it two days ago -that the consti-tationalists are at the bottom of it, but there is no evidence to support this, and the idea is indignantly repudiated yesterday by the Siglo and the Razon, the two represent atives of the constitutional party. It is even more certain that it does not come from the «blanco» or nationalist party, who are among the warmest supporters of Sr. Cues-tas. The real culprits are most probably the «colorados» themselves, or rather that large section of the party who still stand on uncertain ground and have neither the energy nor the political morality to repudiate the «collectiv-ists» and disown them as members of the same party. Indeed, we do not think it would be too much to say that this is the real secret of the so called works for «colorado conciliation,» which is really little more than admitting the thin end of the wedge for the complete restoration of the «collectivists » Some ugly rumors are already affoat in this connection, and it is to be hoped that time will prove them to be false We cannot refrain from referring once more to the significant fact that Sr. Cuestas is the best and most honest president the «colorado» party has given the country for many years, and yet he has to look for support almost anywhere except from the members of the «colorado» party.

This does not redound to the credit of that party. Anyhow, whatever truth there may be in the reports referred to above, the wind is rather taken effect, that the Provisional President, in conversing with regard to the future elections, has frankly expressed that his sole aspiration is to secure the participation of all the parties in the reestablishment of constitutional order and that in his opinion this task should be undertaken in the fullest liberty, so that the elections of Senators and Deputies, and later on that of President of the Republic, should take place free of obligations to vote for specified per-sons The election of the citizen to occupy the presidency of the Republie in the constitutional period now being prepared, should be an en-tirely free act of the future Chambers, who will select by their vote the person they consider most apt to carry forward the work of the definite reconstruction of the country. These declarations should show that Sr. Cuestas has no intention of imposing his own candidature, either by the exercise of official influence, or against the wish of his party, and therefore those who having a better candidate to bring forward, wish to oppose it, may do so in the ordinary course of affairs and wifhout recourse to underhand in-

The object of Brazil has always been to try to obtain a situation on the left bank of the magnificent estuary of the Rio de la Plata. The ardent desire of the Government at Bue-nos Aires has been to be sole master of the same magnificent outlet. Neither has been powerful enough to attein its end, but each at least, has been able to prevent the other from taking or keeping Montevideo with its splendid posi-tion. In 1830 a constitution was drawn up, and General Rivera was elected president for four years; at the end of his term of office he headed a revolution against his legal successor General Oribe, and forced him to abdicate in 1838. Oribe was chiefly appropried by townspeeple and large supported by townspeople and large landowners; Rivera by the gauchos. The colorados overthrew President Giro at the end of 1853: General Flores was elected president eral Flores was elected president in 1854 but had to consent to the occupation by Brazil of part of the country under the pretext of keeping order. The Brazilian troops allowed the advanced colorados of the partido de la defensa to overthrow him in August 1855. The victors had to consent to an arrest victors had to consent to an arrangement by which Bustamente was made temporary president: the reconciliation of Flores with Oribe resulted in the election of a man foreign to party politics, Pereira, on March 1st. 1856. The death of Oribe, and the inaction of Flores allowed Pereira to remain in of-fice till the expiry of his term not-withstanding that the colorados took up arms under Colonel Diaz. He arranged in 1859 a treaty with Argentina and Brazil which declared the neutrality and independence of the country.

Bernardo Berro, one of the chiefs of the blanco party, was elected president on March 1st. 1860. In April 1863, General Flores, began civil war, with the moral support of Argentina and Brazil. Aguirre, who was elected provisional pre-sident in March 1864 by the members of Congress who had remained faithful to Berro, was unable to put down this insurrection. In September Brazil declared war on Uruguay and thus completed the triumph of Flores, who enter-ed Montevideo on 23rd Feb. 1865.

With the title of Provisional Governor, Flores was actually dictator. He formed an alliance with Brazil and Argentina against Paraguay and gained a victory at Yatay on 17th Aug. 1865 over the troops of Lopez. In 1868 he decided to convoke a congress, there having been none for three years. Flores tock advantage of his dictatorship to pass some useful mea-sures, to undertake public works, and to attract immigrants; during his reign the material prosperity of the country was greatly devel-

A few days after the opening of this congress Flores was murdered His successor Battle vigorously persecuted the confederates of this plot. The blancos, exasperated by this persecution, found a favourable moment to rise in 1870; the war lasted two years. The pacifi-cation of the country was due to the conciliatory character of Go-mensoro, president of the senate, an upright and moderate man, who had assumed the pro-visional presidency at the ex-piry of the term of power of Battle in January 1872 Ellauri of the colorado party was elected president in March 1873. Being discontented with him, his own party deposed him in 1875, and elected Varela, but forced him to resign in March 1876. Colonel Laterre seized the dictatorship and kept order for four years. had to go into liquidation. The legislative elections of 1893 having Spain Brasil been carried out under government Banda Oriental to elect a new president. Their choise was Giro, who belonged to neither party and who tried to concillate both.

The colorados overthrew Presidence of reflection: two candidates remained in the list, Dr. Ellauri and Gomensoro. Ellauri was elected after 12 days vot-ing: he resigned, on account of the smallness of his majority, a few hours afterwards. Then Idiarte Borda, son of a French Basque, was elected. This man was but a puppet in the hands of the ex-president, whose brother Miguel he appointed Minister of Interior; he appointed Angel Brian, a man known as the instrument of the system of corruption; lying and dishonour, to be his secretary. The financial system was the same and, the Congressmen being creatures of the Government, there was practically a dictatorship. The best men of the colorado party, joined the blancos, and demanded free elections. In 1896 the insurgent banner was raised (November) part has practically a second to the colorado party banner was raised experience. ber) near the Brazilian frontier by the brothers Saraiva: twice the re-bellion seemed to be put down, but as Borda took no steps to ap-pease his enemies it broke out again with greater force than ever. In June 1897 the two parties seemed disposed to make terms. The president was accused of having financial interests in the continuation of the war; he was universally hated and on August 25th. a man of his own party, a colorado, shot him dead in the middle of a ceremony.

The President of the Senate, Juan Cuestas, an honest, energetic and well educated gentleman, took the reins of Government. He belonged to that part of the colorado party which left the Herrera y Obes and Borda band of brigands. He at once decided to govern without any display of party spirit and began at once to open peace negotiations. On September, 18th., peace for Valparaiso was concluded.

However, Congress, which was elected by a fraud under Herrera, did not aid Cuestas in his good work, and on 11th, February 1898 work, and on 11th, February 1898




