SUSPENSION OF THE TREASURY

CERTIFICATES.

RETURN TO CASH PAYMENTS. The sensation of the day has been the announcement of the resolution of the Government, rather surprisng after some of its recent declarations, to suspend further issue of the Treasury Certificates, and to resume payment in cash of its monthly local obligations, commencing at once with those for August now due. As regards the Certificates in circulation, ten months, namely from November, 1897, to July, 1898, inclusive, it is understood that they will be converted into an internal debt of 6 % interest and 1 % annual amor-

The above step was decided upon in Cabinet Council on Friday afternoon, and announced the same evening though not before some inking of it had crept out, accounting for the collapse of the Certificates on the Bolsa. The Decree setting forth the change is expected to see the light this morning or to-morrow. The principal reasons given, we understand, are the obvious failure of the steps taken by the Government to appreciate the mar-ket quotation of the Certificates to arrest the steady fall which has been going on for some three months or more, and the necessity of taking some radical step to improve the situation of administrative employees, who, with the depressed quotation of the Certificates were subjected to an enforced discount of £0 to 25 % on their salaries.

So far as can be judged without having seen the Decree, the step was both justified and necessary as an administrative measure, and as such will be welcomed by the large class immediately dependent on the Government. But as a financial measure, it is very much open to criticism. There is no doubt that the sudden suspension of conversion of the Certificates, especially after all the assurances the Govern-ment had given that they would not be interfered with, has been a hard hit for those who had placed their money in them—though, for the matter of that, not a few of these were mere speculators for whom no very great pity can be felt. For some time past these Certificates had been the object of a .dead set on the part of a clique of Bolsa . bears . who had done all they could to depreciate them for the double purpose of injuring the credit of the Government and of gaining an exorbitant interest, and we do not think any one can be very sorry that these speculat-ors are now whoist with their own ors are now whoist with their own petard» - indeed, it may be said that they themselves are responsible for having practically forced the step on the Government. There was great indignation over the matter in the Bolsa yesterday—the Certificates were one of the salves in which there was most

Indeed, the change had to come sooner or later - the system of the Certificates could not be made perpetual - so that the only real uestion is whether the moment for the change has been wisely chos-en, and of this we think the Government may be allowed to be the best judge. As to the new debt which has to be created, and which is a legacy of the past administra-tion rather than a creation of the present for the moment we cannot say what provision the Government is prepared to make for it but of this it is premature to speak until the plans of the Government are fully known, so we reserve further com-ment until the appearance of the corresponding Decree.

POLITICAL NOTES.

In the Council of State, on Friday, approval was given to the Bill providing for the construction of a bridge over the river Cunapiru, Department of Rivera. There was no other business of public interest. In addition to the excitement

caused in the market by the sus-pension of the Treasury Certific-ates, with which we dealt apart, the political world has been greatly agitated by rumors of more or less the usual alarmist description, and probably of the usual malicious «nollectivist» origin. malicious «collectivist» origin.
These rumors insist very strongly on the discovery of another military conspiracy, but, so
far as is only generally known,
the only basis consists in the
eternal intriguer Dr. Julio Herrera (who more than ever ought to be in prison or on the scaffold) having addressed insidious letters to certain military officers, endeav-ouring to subvert them from their loyalty to Sr. Cuestas. One of these was addressed to Col. Buquel, who immediately placed it in the hands of Sr. Cuestas. A copy of this letter was published in yesterday's Tribuna, and it is worthy of the mephistophelian character of its author, who, as usual, contrives to invert all notions of honor and morality. As it happens, he completely mistook his man, and Col. Buquet has published a vigorous reply, affirming his loyalty to the present situation, declaring that he wished to have nothing to do with Dr. Herrera or his policy, and qualifying the latter's letter as an unmitigated piece of impertinence. We hope Dr. Herrera is satisfied. There have also been rumors of Cabinet dissensions and ministerial resignations, but these are entirely without foundation. It is certainly astonishing how these rumors, proved false again and again still find credence each time they are floated. For our part, judging from the experience of the last six months, the greater the number of rumors, the firmer the situa-tion, and it is only when they die out that there is real danger, as shown by the military outbreak of July 4, which came at a moment of apparently complete tranquillity. It is hardly necessary to say that conspirators who mean business do not publish their plans beforehand, and therefore, although no doubt there is a malicious object in the chronic circulation of these alarmist ru-

mors, they should not be regarded as forerunners of action. The Decree has been published accepting the resignation of General Salvador Tajes as Chief of the Staff, and temporarily entrusting the duties to the 2nd Chief Col. Antonio Marquez. The letters exchanged between Gener-al Tajes and President Cuestas, which have also been made public, should leave no doubt as to the genuiness of the former's plea of ill-nealth as a reason for his resignation, and Sr. Cuestas expresses the hope that before long General Tajes will be able to return to the post. Whether this will be kept open for him, we cannot say. There are rumors that it will be offered to General Pedro Callorda. not a very popular choice. There is not the least foundation for the rumors of the resignation of Gen-eral Nicomedes Castro as Minister

hint over the Dreyfus scandal in France, is that Col. Henry did not commit suicide, but was mur-dered to prevent him making more revelations! The French Cabinet does not seem to have been able to make up its mind to order a revivion of the Dreyfus case, though all the Ministers are said to be in favor of it except the Minister of War Mr. Cavaignac. Public opinion in favor of revision is strengthening. though the enemies of Drey-lus assert that it would only result in a fresh condemnation. The unfortunate Dreyfus himself is kept in complete ignorance of all that is passing. The friends of Mr. Zola are jubilars, and assert that before long be will be able to return to France the hero of the day. It is noteworthy that Generals Boisdeffre and Gonse. who have just resigned from the Staff, were two of the officers principally accused by Zola of being concerned in the injustice committed with Dreyfus. Zola evidently knew what he was talking about, and time is proving him to have been in the right.

- Another important piece of telegraphic news, is that of an alleged offensive and defensive alliance having been arranged between Gi. Britain and Germany—an announcement which is certainly a surprise if true. So far, however, little or nothing seems to be known of the details, except that one of the bases s the consent of Germany to the British occupation of Delagoa, on the east coast of South Africa, in re-turn for which Germany will be accorded complete liberty of action in Asia Minor.

THE SINS OF TEETOTALERS. HOSPITAL.

The Midland Branch of the Brit ish Medical Association has the advantage of possessing a President, in the person of Dr. Carline, who, in addition to the acquirements and the reputation which have conducted him to that distinguished position, has been en-dowed by Nature with the inestimable gift of common sense, and with the courage necessary to make public the conclusions to which it leads. We have taken as the title of this article, that of his Presidential address; and we desire to congratulate him, and still more those who had the pleasure of hearing him, upon the robustness of its charact-er and upon the truth of its allegations. He pointed out, not for the first time, but none the loss effectively, that the propaganda of teeto-talism is purely destructive; and that active members of the seet, or body, or whether they call them-selves, have never made the smallest attempt to provide a substitute for the alcohol which they condemn In Lincoln, as Dr. Carline, speak-ing from complete local knowledge, points out, all endeavours to improve the water supply of the place have been opposed by teetotalers who have occupied official positions in relation to the sub ject, and have been neglect-ed or ignored by those who were only private individuals. It has long been one of the common-places of sanitation that cholera, typhoid and probably other diseases. find in polluted water their most ordinary channel of conveyance; and yet who ever heard of a teetotaler who, at the same time, was a convinced and earnest advocate for the protection and the improvement of the sources of supply? Such en-terprises as those of the Salutaris Company, or of the Puralis Compa-ny, have never been actively encouraged by teetotalers as such; and the general insecurity of water drinking has passed into a pro-verb which they have done absolutely nothing to disprove, even in this paradise of faddists, the United

Abroad matters are still worse. We were once present when a very distinguished public man, on the eve of a journey to Italy, asked the late Sir Richard Quain how best to preserve his health during his absence «Oh,» was the reply, «there is not much to fear as long as you do not drink any water.» The intending traveller was a somewhat hard man, not easily moved to any display of feeling, but the advice and the contained imputation were too much for him. «Quain,» he said, speaking with a manifest effort and with a broken voice, eyou have known me very intimately for twenty years. Did you ever see me touch it? And, if not water, what then? The majorcity of the so-called *temperance drinks are commonly supposed, rightly or wrongly, to contain, of course, for the purposes of preservation only, at least as much alcohol as those which they are designed to replace; and the abominations of the cott age teapot are sufficiently known to every practitioner whose lot it has been to attend to the out-pa-tients of any great hospital. Sir James Paget, with a perfection of common sense which at least bordered upon genius, pointed out many years ago that in this country neither teetotalers nor drunkards have ever formed more than a small section of the population The enormous majority of Britons and of Irishmen are the des-cendants of many generations of moderate drinkers; and Britons and Irishmen are what they are, with their achievements in the past recorded in undying literature, and with the events of to-day showing that they have in no way fallen from the standards of former generations of their race. In some districts they have produced what is probably the most wholesome of beverages, cider; in others the na-tural beer has been in greater favour; in all, as a rule, they have constantly consumed diluted alcohol in some of its infinitely varied forms. It may well be maintained that such experience as this, extending over many cen-turies and affecting countless mul-titudes of men and women, is of greater value than the results ob-tained by placing bits of tissue under the microscope of the pathol-


