#### POLITICAL NOTES.

The political world remains fairly quiet, and for the moment there is no special topic of interest. Our contemporaries congratulate the ·Colorado» convention on the result of its sittings, now concluded, which they think has been to make a step upward in the organisation and autonomy of the party. It has also been shown that the tenden-cies of the large majority of the party are not, as was feared by some and pretended by others, opposed to the policy of political and administration reform initiated by Sr. Cuestas If this really be so, we hope that the party will prove it in the future by giving him more decided and efficacious support. The public will not find it easy to forget that the only obstruction and opposition to his policy has come from «colorado» elements, some being in tacit opposition and others in open rebellion. It is significant, to use no other word, that the most respectable «colorado» governos as the Ropublic has vet ernment the Republic has yet had should meet with this recep-tion from its own party and should find its warmest adherents and supporters outside that party, and it makes one doubt whether the «glorious traditions» of which the «colorados» are never tired of boasting are in favor of honest and reformatory government such as Sr. Cuestas is trying to give, or whether they found their truest expression in the entirely discredit-able and disastrous governments of Santos, Julio Herrera and Idiarte Borda.

The Executive has approved and The Executive has approved and declared in force the new Regulations for Railway Control, drawn up by Sr. A. Madslena, and which is applicable to all the guaranteed railways. The principle clauses of the Regulations are as follows: — The monthly appropriate shall be presented not be. accounts shall be presented not la ter than the last third (f third week) of the month following the one completed For the purpose of the provisional quarterly pay-ment of the guarantee, the Com-panies shall draw up their accounts in the usual torm, adding a simple summary of the results of the quarter's working, from which the Control office shall arrange for the payment through the Ministries of Foment and Finance. The half yearly accounts shall be presented not later than in the third part of which generally stop at a pier near the hotel.

The Companies must further always supply the following data: the tariffs and time-tables, further notifying any changes in the same; the Annual Reports of the Companies may make between themselves relative to combined services; copies of the contracts for leases, freights, transport, etc. made with private persons, and of any changes in the same; advice of all financial operations carried out; notification of any improvements proposed to be effected; any ad referendum agreement between two or more of the Companies must be arranged directly through the Ministry of Foment. contrary to what was announced a fortnight ago, the Government will allow a month's prolonga tion of the term for paying the property tax (contribución inmobilia-ria) which should have expired yesterday. Although we are opposed to making a general practice of the prolongation as was the cus-tom of previous Governments, we think that it is quite justified in the present year. We would take this opportunity of pointing out teat the necessity for this constant prolongation might be avoided in future years by making the tax payable in October and November, or even December, instead of August and September which are always months of depression and the most trying to the propriet-or on a small scale. As it is arranged at present, the tax falls due in the least convenient period of the year, and hence the term for payment almost always has to be

The post of 1st Clerk of the Trea-sury of the Custom House having fallen vacant, the Government has ordained that it shall be filled by a competitive examination between the two clerks immediately inferior, This is an entirely new departure which has been warmly applauded by most of our contemporaries. It is understood that the Government intends to apply the same system to such other posts as may fall vacant in the future, where poss-

This we very much venture to doubt. We cannot bring ourselves to believe that the C uncil will lend itself to so entirely retrogressive a step, which would be viewed with disgust by all the more educated classes.

#### THE ASSASSINATION OF THE EMPRESS OF AUSTRIA.

GENEVA, SEPT. 10. The Empress of Austria has been assassinated here She arrived on Saturday last from Territet and was staying at the Hotel Beau Riv-age Her Majesty was stabbed by an Italian named Luigi Luccesi. He struck her as she was walking from the hotel to embark on one of the steamers to go back to Territet, which generally stop at a pier near

GENEVA, SEPT. 10.

Her Majesty had just left the Hotel Beau Rivage, and was walk-ing to the steamboat landing on the Quai du Mont Blanc She had reached the Brunswick Monument in the square when a man coming from the opposite direction suddenly rushed up and dealt the Empress a violent blow—to all appearance a blow with the fist. Her Majesty fell, but almost immediatey rose to her feet, and with the assistance of one of the ladies in waiting and some of the passers by succeeded in reaching the steamboat pier. Her Majesty bad hardly reached the deck of the steamer when she fainted. The Captain at first hesitated to give the order for departure but are resulted. departure, but eventually the steamer put off. As the Empress did not regain consciousness the steamer was put about before she had left the harbour, and returned to the pier Meanwhile the ladies in waiting who had been endeavouring to bring the Empress back to con-sciousness had observed a small stain of blood on her Majesty's under garments.

When the pier was reached a stretcher was hastily improvised with oars and sailcloth, and on this the Empress was carried into the Hotel Beau Rivage Drs. Golay and Major and a priest were immediately summoned and a telegram was depatched to the Emperor Francis Joseph with the sad intelligence. All efforts to bring the Empress back to life proved unawailing, and her Majesty expired at three

o'clock. The medical examination showed that the assassin must have used a small triangular saw-file. After striking the fatal blow the murderer made off. He ran along the Rue des Alpes with the inten-tion evidently of entering the vast Square des Alpes, where he would easily have baffled pursuit, but before reaching the square he was seized by two cabinen, named Victor Villemain and Louis Cha martin, who had witnessed the martin, who had witnessed the rrime from their stations on the cab rank on the quay and had at once set off in pursuit. They handed over their prisoner to a boatman named Albert Siaux, and a gendarme named Kaiser, who conveyed him to the Paquis Police Station. lice Station.

The murderer offered no resistance. On the contrary, he appeared to be in high spirits and sang snatches of popular songs. On arriving at the police station the prisoner de clared that he was an Anarchist without means, and that his ani-mosity was only directed against the rich.

Immediately after the examination of the prisoner the magistrate and his colleagues proceeded to the scene of the murder. A strong po-lice patrol was placed outside the hotel, in front of which an immense crowd had collected. At the same time numbers of gendarmes were told off to search for the weapon used by the murder. The detective force is making active inquiries to ascertain whether Luccesi had any accomplices.

VIENNA, SEPT. 11. The Empress's lady-in-waiting, Countess Szapary, who was with the Empress, describes the details

«We arrived in Geneva on Friday at noon, the Empress being desirous to revisit the town, which she was much pleased with last year. She took long walks on the shore of the lake, visited Baroness Rothschild's gardens, and the public park. On Saturday we were to return by steamer via Territet to Caux, the Empress preferring to go by steamer and allowing the suite to go by rail. The steamer was to leave at two. The Empress was in excellent spirits and perfectly well. At half past one we left the hotel, walking along the quay Mont Blanc slowly side by side. Sudden-ly I noticed a man coming at a last step from the lake up to the Empress. He came round a tree that stood between him and us, his foot slipped and he made a plunge forward, stretching out his hand, as I thought, to regain his equilibrium. He then ran away. I did not notice that he touched the Empress. As I looked her way I saw her sink down, and caught her in my arms, asking if she felt any pain.

on board helped me to attend the unconscious Empress. It all happened so quickly that nobody could suspect what had been done, I saw no weapon in the man's hand. As

the ladies opened her bodice, we saw no blood. When her dress was open she recovered and rose to her leet, saying in a clear voice, «Tell me what has happened?» She did not speak after that, but sank back again, became deadly pale, and breathed hard and harder.

In the meantime the steamer had left the shore. I asked the captain to turn back. By the time we landed the Empress had lost consciousness. She was carried to the Hotel, and laid on a bed, where she did after the steamer than the steamer that the steamer than the steamer than the steamer than the steam where she died after a few minutes. I am positive she did not know she had been murdered. Only when her dress had been entirely removed did the blood and wound become visible.

There have one or two minor incidents, arising from quarrels among themselves, but no disorders of consequence. Their delegates have solicited an audience of the President, which will be granted to-day. Sr. Galceran, proprietor of the steam trawls against the use of which they are protesting, has applied to the police for protection, considering his person in danger. According to a contemin danger. According to a contemporary, the fishing industry supports some 4000 persons, and the use of the steam trawls threatens to kill the industry, as it destroys the eggs, spawn and fry of the fish, and drives them away from their usual breeding places. It is alleged that there is already a very notable diminution in the quantity of the fish since the steam trawls were first used some two years ago The question is evidently a serious one.

-A commotion has been caused at several European Courts by the morganatic marriage of Princess Sybil of Hesse, sister of the Land-grave of Hesse-Cassel, who is a first cousin of the Princess of Wales and of the Duchess of Connaught, her Serene Highness being a niece of the Queen of Denmark and of the late Prince Frederick Charles of Prus-aia Princess Sybil's sister is the Hereditary Princess of Anhalt-Dessau, and her younger brother is married to Princess Margaret of Prussia, sister of the Emperor William Princess Sybil, who has a fortune of 100,000 fr. a year, was married at Franktort to Baron Alexander Von Becke. The Princess has always been a great favourite with the Royal family of Denmark, and at one time there was much talk at Copenhagen of her marrying the Emperor Nicholas, who was then Czarewitch.

-The lugitive Caliph Digna Parcha is said to be hidden in a wood on the road to Kordolan, where he is surrounded by the Arabs sent in his pursuit. The Anglo-Egyptian Government has resolved to rebuild the city of Khartum at some distance from its present unhealthy site on the bank of the Nile.—The Blue Book relative to the Fashoda question has been published in London. According to this the British Government affirms its rights to all the valley of the Upper Nile, and claims that Fashoda is a former Egyptian possession, now reconquered. It attributes no political significance to the presence of the expedition of Mr Marchand, not regarding him as an authorised representative of the French Government.

#### BUENOS AIRES.

-The 1895 census of the Argentine republic showed the popula-tion to be 3,954,911, that is, an increase of 120 % on that of 1869. To this figure must be added about 60,000 people who for various reasons were not included in the cen sus, making the total population 4 044-911. The increase is therefore 4.98 % per year, which makes it rank third in this respect among civilised nations. Santa Fe is the province the population of which increased most rapidly since the has last census, its increase being 346 %. The urban population of the Re-public is 1.690.966 and the rural 2,263.945. As for the fluvial population, 19595 people were registered in 54 ports. A notable fact is that males outnumber females: the two sexes being 2.088, 919 and 1.865-992 respectively: but amongst the exclusively Argentine population the opposite is the fact, there being 1 452.952 males to 1.497.432 females The number of Argentines residing abroad is calculated at 49 .--B. A. Herald.

-The latest advices about the lo-custs are that the Jewish colonies in Villaguay have been invaded and the crops destroyed. The Col-onization Company owns 70,000 hectares there, of which from 25 to 30 thousand are under cultivation, so that the great loss to the farmers can easily be imagined should the crops not come on again. For this rain is absolutely necessary, and lacking it there will be no harvest. The tarmers made no move whatever to cope with the plague, and the subcommission recommends the Head Commission to be inexorable in imposing fines. The great work of extinction is being briskly pushed ahead and giving good results On Wednesday in Santa Fé there were 149 50.) kilos of «voladoras and 590 kilos of eggs accounted for, as well as 51,332 kilos of «voladora» in Entre Rios.

Things seem to be improving in Chubut, as we see that Congress has been approached by the Chu-but Railway Company for leave to extend on a further 50 kilometres from Trelew. #### LONDON NOTES

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 12. The Empress of Austria was assassinated on Saturday by an Italian Anarchist. The Empress was walking to one of the steamers to go on the lake at Geneva with only Countess Szapary in attend-ance when a man rushed at her and dealt her a blow knocking her to the ground. Her Majesty had been stabbed, but was not aware of the fact. She rose and walked on hoard the steamer, where she fainted after it had started from the shore. It returned to the pier, and the unconscious Empress was carried back to her botel, where she expired shortly afterwards Luccesi, the Anarchist, was captured, and glories in his crime.

It appears that Luccesi had at first intended to kill the Duke of Orleans, but was unable to find him, and then heard of the arrival of the Empress Elisabeth in Ge-

Members of the British Association now meeting at Bristol chiefly devoted themselves on Saturday to excursions, only four sections gathering for business. The Bish-op preached a special sermon in the Cathedral yesterday.

There was a special opening or-chestral service in Gloucester Ca-thedral yesterday of the Musical Festival which is to be held in the city this week. Three generations of Gloucester conductors directed the music, and the sermon was preached by the Dean.

Several members of the Brigade were injured on Saturday while en-gaged in extinguishing a fire on the premises of a rag and waste paper merchant in the Borough. There were several other outbreaks in London, and last night a house in Walworth was entirely wrecked by an explosion caused by seeking for an escape of gas with a light.

A very serious accident occurred on Saturday afternoon near Deal, a large brake conveying excursionists being overturned and all the passengers, some 25 in number, thrown into the road. Several of these were badly injured, and it is feared that one lady will not re-

In spite of the continued hot weather football was largely indulged in throughout England on Saturday, and there were very large crowds to see the League Championship matches. By a curious turn of fortune not one of the nine matches furnished a success for the visiting side, for six matches were won by the home club and three others were drawn. Aston Villa were beaten by Bury, Sheffield United drew with Notts County, Notts Forest (the English Cup holders) lost to Sheffield Wednesday, Sunderland beat Li-verpool, Everton beat Newcastle, Wolverhampton drew with Preston North End, Stoke beat Burnley, Blackburn Rovers beat Bolton Wanderers, and West Bromwich drew with Derby County. The southern professional teams had some interesting games, and Ithere was also a little Rugby Union play in the provinces

First-class cricket came to a close on Saturday with the conclusion of the Hastings Festival, when Rest of England deleated the Surrey and Sussex team by four wickets.
