NEWS OF THE DAY

Twentieth Sunday after Trinity.—*Saints Severinus and German.*—Battleground of Edgell, 1642—296 days past, 69 to the end of the year.

POLITICAL NOTES.

In the Council of State, on Friday, a pension of \$1800 the year was voted to the widow of the late Dr. Carlos Maria Ramirez, in recognition of his public services. The Bill authorising the 2nd issue of the Extraordinary 1897 Loan was approved in general without remark. Dr. Otero Mendoza presented a Bill for the general reform of the Consular service, which was referred to the Committee the discussion of Dr. Alonso's Bill being meanwhile suspended. The amendments in the Extradition Treaty with Spain were approved in general. The Bill for direct delivery of registered letters was fully approved in general and in detail without debate, thus settling in a few minutes a reform which has been pending for two or three years and which might just as easily have been sanctioned long ago. There was no further business of public interest.

Our contemporaries contrive to fill a column or so of their space with references to the revolutionary rumors, but we do not find a single item worth repeating, and the alarm is once more wanting. Telegrams from the frontier towns continue to report everything perfectly tranquil. According to the *Bien*, Com Castro who is under arrest in the Cerro fortress, had stated to an interviewer that the conspirators in Buenos Aires are all «jolly hard up» and that they have too much to do in keeping themselves to think of organising revolutions. Nevertheless, we note that one of them, Dr. F. Acosta y Lara, has found the means to publish and circulate a pamphlet containing an absurd and scurrilous personal attack on Sr. Cuestas, and accusing him of all the offences imaginable. They will gain nothing by this. There is the usual fertile crop of rumors afloat, but none worth repeating.

TRAMWAY REGULATIONS.

The Municipality has just sanctioned and the Government has confirmed a new set of Regulations for the Tramways of the Capital. These, if not entirely perfect, are at all events free from the absurdities and puerilities of the Theatre Regulations recently issued. We mention below some of the principal clauses, with comments.

Every car must be swept and dusted on being put into service, and must be washed and disinfected at least twice a week. Wooden lattices must be employed in the floors of the closed cars (the object of this is not clear). Closed cars must have ventilators (we presume this is what is meant, though the word used is *claraboyas*—skylights), and open cars must be built with windows and persiennes in front (why?) The tariff, number of passengers that may be carried and a copy of the Regulations must be conspicuously posted in every car.

It is forbidden to stop the cars at the street crossings or on inclines. (This should be referred to the lady travellers who habitually endeavour to stop the cars at the most inconvenient places. The «incline» also requires definition.

For instance, Calle 18 de Julio between the two plazas is one long incline, but it would be absurd to pretend that the cars must not be stopped from Calle Rio Negro to Calle Andes and would be exceedingly inconvenient to passengers.)

The guards are authorised to call the assistance of the police in the case of passengers who insist on mounting a car that is full. (We doubt if this will be complied with, for men are habitual offenders in this respect.)

The Municipality has had the remarkable idea of measuring the capacity of the closed cars by the number of windows, forgetting that the windows may vary greatly in breadth, and has established the following scale: 8 windows, 20 passengers; 7 windows, 18 passenger; 6 windows 16, and 5 windows 12. In the open cars four passengers are allowed on each bench, which we hope will put a stop to practice of squeezing in five. Four passengers are allowed on the back foot-board of open cars, and two on closed cars, but only when the seats are full. Passengers are forbidden to ascend or descend by the front steps.

Smoking is forbidden in closed cars. (Hitherto it has only been forbidden when there are ladies present. The new rule will be difficult to enforce in face of long established custom. A rule might very advantageously have been introduced, and would have been welcomed by many travellers, especially ladies, forbidding smoking on the two or three front benches of open cars.) The drivers are forbidden to smoke in open cars, and the guards in any cars.

When a car is full, a board must be shown with the word «complete» (a long wanted reform.) The cars must carry boards indicating their route by day, and must show the same by colored lights at night.

THE HURRICANE IN THE WEST INDIES.

KINGSTON, JAMAICA (Via New York.) SEPT. 23.

Mail advices just to hand confirm the estimate that in the recent hurricane 300 lives were lost in St. Vincent, apart from the numerous shipping disasters that occurred. The coast is strewn with wrecks, many of the vessels destroyed being from Barbados.

The hurricane raged from ten o'clock in the morning till two in the afternoon completely wrecking the island. Two hundred houses were demolished at Kingstown, while the suburbs, Cox Heath and Montebello, were blotted out. Among the principal buildings destroyed were the Anglican and Catholic Churches, a fine new hospital, and Fort Charlotte, while all the other public edifices were more or less injured.

Cloudbursts from the mountains afterwards swept much

of the ruins out to sea, together with many of the dead and injured. Throughout the island the destruction was wholesale, nearly all the estates being ruined, buildings razed, and cultivation obliterated. The following towns and villages were destroyed: Rose Place, Grand Sable, Arnos Vale, Mount Pleasant, Argyle, Wallilabo, Barron Allie, Layon, and Buccament. Georgetown suffered considerably. There is no approximate estimate of the damage, but the island is practically ruined.

St. Lucia suffered mostly by rain and the landslips which it caused. The deluge lasted ten hours. The Cul de Sac and Rousseau Valleys, the centres of the cane and cacao cultivation, were converted into lakes and partly filled with debris from the mountains. The crops were ruined, while many of the plantations were also wrecked. Elsewhere serious damage was inflicted especially at Monstacab, where an avalanche three miles long, covering the valley to the width of a mile, overwhelmed the Ruby and two other estates. A similar avalanche partly destroyed the Diamond, Pearl, and San Jacques cacao plantations.

Castries suffered to some extent, chiefly from a tidal wave, which swept over half the town, wrecking a portion of Bay-street. Thirteen lives were lost. The amount of the damage has not been computed, but it is incomparably less than in St. Vincent.

The hurricane struck Barbados on the night of the 10th, wrecking and sweeping away 10,000 houses, and damaging thousands more. Three quarters of the inhabitants were left homeless, and over a hundred lost their lives. Bridgetown, so far as is known, was partially destroyed, while the suburbs, St. Michael and Belleville, were totally demolished. The desolation in the country is awful, owing to the destruction of the provision grounds. While all the parishes suffered, the greatest distress prevails at St. Michael, Christ-church, and St. Philip. All the sugar estates were damaged, many being completely wrecked. The cane crop, although suffering severely, was not totally ruined, as at first reported, not more than a fifth of the whole being lost. The total damage in Barbados, not including the loss of sugar cane and provisions, is estimated at about 1,500,000 dollars.

During the hurricane at Barbados the temporary residence which Sir J. S. Hay, the Governor, was occupying, pending the repairing of the Palace, collapsed, burying him and his son in the ruins, but neither sustained anything more than slight bruises.

Animals that Count.

Several years ago there lived in Cincinnati a mule which was employed by a street railway company in hauling cars up a steep incline. This animal was hitched in front of the regular team and unhitched as soon as the car arrived at the top of the hill. It made a certain number of trips in the forenoon (I have forgotten the number, but will say fifty for the sake of convenience) and a like number in the afternoon, resting for an hour at noon. As soon as the mule completed its fiftieth trip it marched away to its stable without orders from its driver. To show that it was not influenced by the sound of the factory whistles and bells the following remarkable action on the part of this animal is vouched for by the superintendent of the line, who gave me these data: On a certain occasion, during a musical festival, this mule was transferred to the night shift, and the very instant it completed its fiftieth trip it started for the stables. It took the combined efforts of several men to make it return to its duty. At night there were no bells or whistles to inform the creature that «quitting time» had come. It had counted the trips, and having finished its full quotation of fifty it thought that the time for rest and food had arrived. Some monkeys give unmistakable evidences of the possession by them of the computing faculty. In 1883 I made the acquaintance of a very intelligent chimpanzee which could count as high as three. That this was not a trick suggested by sensual impulses I had ample opportunity of satisfying myself. The owner of the animal would leave the room, no one being present but myself, and when I would call for two marbles or one marble or three marbles, as the case might be, the monkey would immediately hand over the required number.

The Duke of Norfolk—A Good Story.

The latest story about the Duke of Norfolk is one of the best we have seen for some time. He was taking a driving tour through the English counties—a holiday treat to which he is much attached, his companions being his sister and Lord and Lady Loudoun. One day quite recently the party stopped in a small county town, which shall be nameless. The Duke went

to send a telegram, and had to wait while several other people were served. He always makes travelling an occasion of observing the working of rural offices, and he noticed with pain that the young lady in charge was very cross and snappish, especially to a poor old woman. When his turn came he handed in his telegram, signed «Norfolk.» The operator threw it back to him. «Put your name,» she snapped. «What is your name, anyway?» «I have signed it,» said the Duke. But the young person, who seems to have been ignorant, as well as discourteous, said, «Nonsense! We don't want the name of a county we want a man's name. Hurry up!» «I will trouble you for another blank, please,» said the Duke, with studious politeness. He filled up the fresh form as follows: «Permanent Sec. G. P. O., London.—Clerk at this office exceedingly insolent to the public. Reprimand severely. Discharge on second complaint.—The Postmaster General.» «This will go free, as it is official,» he remarked, as he handed it to the girl. She read it through, then turned white, and looked ready to faint. When she had recovered her voice, she begged pardon so penitently that the Duke, whose official sternness hides a very kind heart, gave her some fatherly advice, talking to her for quite a long time; then, after tearing up the telegram, lifted his hat courteously, and left her to reflections. The *Lady*, which tells the story, adds, «Probably the public in that village will have no further cause to complain of the clerk's ill manners, but some of us are tempted to wish that the Duke would go round the London offices now and then.»

Camel Training.

An officer who has been residing some time in Egypt, where camel riding has been obligatory, sends the following graphic description of his experiences with that amiable and useful animal:—«You can well imagine that there's a circus around here while the usual riding instruction is going on. When the untamed camels first arrived at our camp I heard a tremendous growling in front of the door, and on going out I saw one of these amiable beasts being led by his keeper, but walking along with every expression of disgust both in his countenance and voice. The man stopped (dido camel), and attempted to tie the beast's forelegs together, when it reared, and, attempting to tie the beast's stomach and head, sending him flying through space as if shot out of a cannon. The man picked himself out of the ditch with a hand on each bruised part, and the camel, which had never ceased roaring, was taken in charge by two other and more robust natives and led to the tents, or rather induced to go by energetic assistance of a very sharp iron rod applied in a most vigorous and miscellaneous manner. Similar exhibitions are being conducted here daily, and we are now ready to lead the recently broken camels. Within three or four days they become tractable. It first formed my opinion of a camel some years ago when I rode across the Arabian deserts, and I see no reason to alter it in any way. The creature has so many talents and so many ways of exhibiting them. And to begin with, it can kick harder, higher, swifter, and oftener than a mule, and can use all four feet at one time in a kicking match. Then it can bite worse than a vicious horse, and buck in a way to make a broncho blush with absolute shame. No rider ever lived who can stay on that perch seven feet from the ground during a camel's exhibitions of gymnastics. Then he can run away when he feels like it, and he is often seized with a desire to slope. Upon an occasion of this kind his rider experiences a sensation between being «blown up» with dynamite or struggling against the throes of an earthquake until all his joints are dislocated, and he drops, a limp, inert mass, to the ground. Then this sweet creature has a way of evincing his displeasure that is at least effectual and convincing. He twists his snake-like neck into a circle, and poking his ugly nose into the face of the rider, opens his cavernous mouth and lets out a roar of disgust in such a fetid breath that the elevated human victim is fairly blown into the middle of the coming month (a week being too short a distance). And yet, with all these high recommendations, which some people might consider objectionable, these are the dear animals I am constantly brought into contact with, and for which I am even beginning to form an affection.—*Road.*

SUNDRIES.

—Shortly before midnight on Friday, a fire broke out in the draper's shop of Sr. Luis Schinca, situated at the corner of Calles 18 de Julio and Plata in the suburb of La Union. Owing to the distance from the city it was a long time before the fire brigade could arrive, and the shop was completely destroyed, the adjacent houses also being seriously injured. The damages are estimated at \$9000, and the property was insured for \$12,000 in the North British and Mercantile Company for which Mr. N. Goddard is agent.

—The fire mentioned above illustrates the danger of leaving popular suburbs like La Union or Pass del Molino without further protection from fire than can reach them from the city, meaning a journey of 40 to 50 minutes for the engines. It is quite time they were provided with small engines of their own.

—The annual «prison visit» will take place on the 26th and 27th instant. Until then the sittings in the Criminal Courts are in suspense.

—A horrible, though not unprecedented, thing has happened in Vienna. The bacteriologist Professor Nothnagel was making experiments with the bacillus of the bubonic plague, when by some accident in the laboratory the infected matter became spread about, so that the Professor and a servant have died of the disease, and a doctor and nurse are attacked by it. There is great alarm in Vienna lest the terrible plague, which is highly infectious, should spread further and become general.

—It is such a long time since we have heard of anyone in the English community winning the big prize in the lottery, that it is with pleasure that we note the gain of the *grande* in the last drawing, \$20,000, was divided between two well-known members of the English Club, Mr. James Saunders and Mr. Bentley Swinden. We hope that others may soon have similar good luck.

—The wedding of Mr. A. Macadam, Manager to Mudd and Co. to Miss Oldham will be celebrated on Tuesday next. Owing to the ill-health of the bride's mother, the proceedings will be confined to the family and intimate friends.

—The police have not yet been able to find the authors of the forgery of tobacco stamps discovered recently. The forged stamps have been found in use in quite a large number of tobacconists' shops, though it remains to be proved whether the proprietors were aware of the forgery.

—A rival has appeared to Robinson Crusoe and his latest competitor Mr. Rougemont. On one of the smaller Galapagos or Turtle Islands (property of Ecuador) a man has been found who was abandoned there fourteen years ago, and who has lived entirely alone ever since. He was found completely naked, and covered with thick hair. He had water in abundance and lived on birds (how did he catch them?) and cactus fruit (prickly pears) the only products of the island. It is to be hoped he will publish his experiences.

—At the Cibils this evening the French Company will present the Comedy «Monsieur Chasse», which is quite new here.

—The melodrama selected for presentation at the Solis Theatre this evening bears the title of «Juan José.» Who John Joseph was, we cannot say at present, but doubtless will be wiser after having seen the piece.

—Mr. P. V. Lander left for England by the «Oropesa» on Friday. The arrivals by the «Magdalena» were Mrs. and Miss Harvey, Mr. J. Ritchie and Mr. J. Taylor.

—The «horticultural hat» question is now being tackled by the Liverpool Philharmonic, one of the leading musical societies in the provinces. The directors have issued the following rather candidly:

LONDON NOTES

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 24. The Queen has been pleased to confer the dignity of a peerage on the Right Hon. George Nathaniel Curzon, Viceroy Designate of India.

The reported death of the Emperor of China is not confirmed. A Paris Correspondent states that Colonel Picquart is in solitary confinement at the Cherche-Midi Prison.

In Paris yesterday, the wife of a deputy who had been attacked by M. Millerand in the columns of the 'Lanterne' went to the office of the paper, and not finding him there, shot a sub-editor.

A largely attended conference of friends of Armenia was opened yesterday at Cardiff, about forty towns being represented. Mr. James Bryce, M.P., who presided, insisted that the mission was humanitarian and philanthropic rather than political.

At the close of a Conference yesterday with several members of Parliament on the subject of the scarcity of water in the East End, Mr. Chaplin, President of the Local Government Board, assured them that nothing in his power would be left undone to ensure to water consumers there, the most ample protection that the Department could afford.

Lieut. Wark, of the Royal Artillery, was brought up at Liverpool yesterday, charged with the wilful murder of Miss Yates, a lady of independent fortune, with whom he had been on intimate terms, and further with conspiring with the deceased for an unlawful purpose.

The will of the late Mr. Woolf Joel has been proved, the value of the testator's estate being provisionally estimated at £1,236,000.

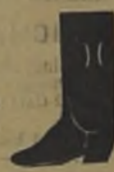
