

We have heard terrible tales of the cost of earmed peaces to Europe, but we earmed peaces to Europe, but we certainly doubt if there is any European Power-or any other country on the face of the globe-that devotes 36.5 % of its internal expenditure to its military organisation Out of the \$1,918 000 devoted to the Department, the Ministry itself costs \$40,572 and the Staff Office costs \$40,072 and the Staff Office \$116 030, so that it may be said the War control costs \$157,202. This provides for a Minister, a Chief of the Staff, a Lieutenant General, six Generals of Division, eleven Gen-erals of Brigade (this does not in-clude sundry Generals on the Jud-cial staff and otherwise employed) and some 99 other officers official staff and otherwise employed) and some 92 other officers, offi-cials, clerks and other dependents, over 110 persons in all. This is staff enough to control the army of an important military power and it is absurd beyond expression when applied to a little State of Uruguay, of 850,000 po-pulation, which has little or no ne-cessity for foreign defence, its neutrality in case of war being guaranteed by treaty. This is «militarism,» sheer and simple, and has merely been devised to keep in uniformed idleness a body of men whose energies would be much better directed to useful and productive work. All these generproductive work. All these gener-als, colonels, and other officers, are absolute superfluities, they render no useful or necessary serrender no useful or necessary ser-vices to the country, they do not help its progress or development or prosperity in any way, they are merely a burden on the land-and, when they devote themselves to political intrigues, as they often do, they become a positive obstruc-tion and a danger. They are mostly occupied --when they are occupied at all, which is not very often-with trying petty offences against discipline, which could be settled just as ef-fectually and without expense by a court martial of the officers of the regiment where the offence occur-red or of the numerous undetached officers who pass nine-tenths of their days in sheer idleness The criminal offences which they are occasionally called upon to try, such as murder, robbery and as-sault, could be much better tried by the civil courts-and this would further have the advantage of teaching the lesson, a very necessary one here, that a military uniform, however bedecked with gold trimming, does not exempt the wearer from obedience to the civil law and authorities, and that the military are not a privileg-ed class apart from the rest of the Republic. Finally, there remain the more important but influence. rarer cases of treason or sedi tion, and these would be better tried by a special court constituted for each case—there are always plenty of unoccupied officers to form such a court—for the exper-ience of this very year has shown that in permanent courts the Judges themselves are not al ways above suspicion. of a hundred times greater import-ance to the public welfare The mowar has abundantly shown that she has become degenerate and may be left out of count when modern problems are proposed for solution; nor is there any reason to believe that she can recover her place among the Nations. Italy, during recent years, has shown an increase of vigour; but present indications are in the direction of a retrograde condition or policy. She has on hand as many difficult prob-lems as she can well manage; and her attempts at the colonization of the East, which, if successful would maintain for her a place among the great powers of Europe, have resulted in disasters and defeat. The nations which today are leading the march of civilization are Russia, Germany, Great Bri tain and the United States. These are the countries which are to give shape and direction to the trend of allairs for the coming generation. How far this leadership will go, how long it will last, and what rel-ation each of those countries will bear to the other and to the politics of the world, remains to be seen: but without doubt these are the gov-erning races and are those only which are advancing in power and

ity to which they will not descend.

If this diagnosis of the present situation and forecast of the future are in any degree correct, the Latin race, we must admit, is in decadence. There is but one re-gion where this race shows any signs of vitality, and that is in this part of the world. Here the Latin part of the world. Here the Latin race governs and gives direction to events and shapes policies, and here there is a positive develop ment which, if slow, is certain and visible. Here there is to be built up a nation or people in whom the Latin element will be greatly pre-dominant; but it will show a mod-ification which is ever to be found upder altered circumstances. The results of the poll taken in Canada on the issue of forbidding the importation, manufacture, or sale of alcoholic liquors show that there is no chance at present of le-gislation on the lines desired by the Prohibitionists. The voting throughout the Dominion is expected to disclose a slight majority in favour of this policy; but the figures re-corded in some of the large towns have yet to be made known. Even if they should be what the Tem-perance enthusiasts desire, the lead given to the Ministry by the popular given to the Ministry by the popular vote will not be strong enough to compel them to act. A Statesman of the capacity of Sir Willrid Laurier is not likely to attack precipitately a problem so man-ifestly unripe as this. The opi-nion of Quebec, a Province in which the Prohibitionists have never been able to make much headway, is decisively expressed by a majority of fitty thousand against the proposal; and in a social question of this magnitude the views of so rich and populous an area can not be over ridden ... The truth is that Prohibition, whether in districts or over large areas, is, and must be, a failure so long as human beingschoose to drink alcoholic beverages. 
