LONDON NOTES THURSDAY, DECEMBER 1. It is reported from India that the Mad Mullah now threatens the Chitral road, and intends to attack Chakdara and Malakand. A Paris Correspondent believes there is reason to conclude that the Criminal Chamber of the Court of Cassation will declare the Dreyfus trial illegal, and the prisoner himself innocent. The military witnesses recently examined have not only prejudiced the case of the prisoner, but have in the minds of the judges strengthened it. The Victorian Legislative Assembly yesterday considered the Estimates, when an amendment was carried against the Government. Sir G. Turner, the Premier, moved the adjournment of the House in order that the Ministry might consider its position. Speaking at a Conservative luncheon at Bristol yesterday, the Chancellor of the Exchequer said a few days ago he was personally attacked by a leading member of the late Radical Government. There appeared to be an impression that he was a warlike individual; he did not recognize himself in that capacity. He was a man of peace, and tried to keep out of private quarrels. Sir Henry Campbell Bannerman called him a swashbuckler because he had expressed the opinion that there should be an open-door in China even at the risk of war. He thought that the policy laid down by him last January was justified by events. Moreover, he had said it would be necessary to continue in the occupation of Fashoda, and that if France insisted upon holding Fashoda, then it would be an unfriendly act, of which England would have to take anxious and careful cognizance. Did anyone disagree with that view? He hated this cant of talk of provocation. There was one thing that was dangerous, and that was priggish diplomacy, which was too polite to say exactly what it meant, and left foreign countries under a misunderstanding of English feeling and determination. Under the presidency of Sir Benjamin Stone M. P., the Conference of the National Union of Conservative Associations was resumed and concluded yesterday. Amongst the subjects on which resolutions were submitted were the Reform of the House of Lords, Food Supply, Preferential Duties, and the Creation of a Roman Catholic University for Ireland. Opening a discussion in the Conference Room of the National Liberal Club last night on 'What is to be done with the House of Lords,' Lord Coleridge held that the constitutional way of reforming or removing that Chamber would be by the creation of new peers as in 1712 and 1834. A large congregation assembled in St. Paul's Cathedral yesterday to witness the consecration of Dr. Weidon, head-master of Harrow, as Bishop of Calcutta, and of Dr. Lytton as Bishop Suffragan, of Southampton. Dr. Butler, the Master of Trinity was the preacher. Dean Farrar lectured at the Church House last evening on 'Temperance Reform as required by righteousness and patriotism.' Delivered to an audience of 1,500, with the Archbishop of Canterbury in the chair, the address inaugurated a series arranged in memory of Dr. R. F. Lees and Mr. J. H. Roper, temperance leaders, who died in 1897. Similar lectures will be delivered at intervals during twenty years, a fund of 1,500l. having been invested in the purchase of an annuity with that object in view. Resolutions passed by the Committee of the National Council of the Evangelical Free Churches are published this morning protesting against the rapid increase and growing aggressiveness of the Romanist party within the Established Church, and suggesting that the three hundredth anniversary of the birth of Oliver Cromwell should be celebrated by a Cromwellian exhibition and demonstration in London on the 26th of April next. Sir J. Voce Moore, the Lord Mayor, has convened a meeting of citizens at the Mansion House this morning, when Lord Kitchener will attend and explain his proposals for the establishment of the Gordon Memorial College at Khartoum. Colonel Gouraud, formerly aide de camp to General Sherman, has telegraphed to the Sirdar guaranteeing at least 1,000l. as a citizen of the great English-speaking sister nation of America. In the big rugby football match at Richmond yesterday, London and the South beat the Universities by two goals and a try to a goal and a try. Oxford University gained a remarkable win over Reigate Priory in Association by 13 goals to none. The St. Andrew's Day matches at Eton were played. The Oppidans beat the Collegers by one try to nothing. Lord Rosebery was present at this game, in which his son, Lord Dalmeny, played a prominent part.
