CRIMINAL JUSTICE IN URUGUAY The following telegram appeared

n yesterday's papers:of a railway employee who murdered superior that had dismissed him for bad conduct.

The above is, no doubt, a somewhat garbled version of a letter the text of which, as published, will reach us by mail in due time. Still, garbled as it is, the general truth of the charges made will be freely recognised by those who have followed the course of criminal justice in this part of the world, and the numerous cases of impunity allowed to crime on which we have so often commented in our columns. The matter is a very serious one indeed, there are few more serious-and it is satisfactory that it should have at last attracted

he London Times. So far only two of our native contemporaries have commented on the telegram. The Sigla—which gave a version rather different to that above in its 2nd edition on Wednesday morning - affects to treat the matter as rather a joke worthy of innocents' Day, and comes to the conclusion that the author of the letter was neiththe author of the letter was neither very truthful nor discreet. It seems to entirely ignore the possibility that there might be good grounds for the charges made, as also the fact that the *Times* is not in the habit of publishing letters from irresponsible or unknown correspondents.

pany us in our campaign against the impunity of crime-treats the matter in a very different spirit and devotes to it a very sensible article of which the following is a free

eFor some time past the press in general has been calling attention to the extreme benevolence with which criminal cases are treated by the Judges. Various concrete cases in which the sentences have been contrary to all reasonable expectation, have shown that there is a serious evil to correct in the punishment of crime. In this matter, the juries have a great share, because, as they are established among us and with the powers given them, they always seem to regard the prisoners, as in given them, they slways seem to regard the prisoners as individuals worthy of their benevolent protection rather than as persons guilty of offences the punishment of which is required by society as a preventive to criminal intentions or purposes. Few citizens go to the discharge of their dunes as jurymen with a clear comprehension of the responsibilities attached. Nearly all of them regard it as a vexatious obligation in which duty has no share except to avoid the penalty for non attendance. When the case has been read (heard) a verdict is drafted according to the opinion of the most experienced or the most.

skilful juryman and this is read to the prisoner, who has already been prepared by his defender for a sympathetic sentiment among the jury. Then comes the sentence of the Judge, which ought to be inspired by the findings of the verdict and be in effect the legal expression of the same. The real result of this double judging of the same case is that, the moral responsibility being divided between the members of the jury as judges of facts and the legal Judge, it more often happens that the final sentence injures society more than it does the criminal. The condition of our penal justice thus gradually loses its prestige and weakens the impulse towards proskilful juryman and this is read to weakens the impulse towards progress, and this explains the general

No one has the right to be offended, when, as in the present case, truth, and not gratuitous slander, is the arm employed. Without question, it is not the laws of the country that favor the absolution of criminals, so much as their mistaken or careless application. The origin of the vice, therefore, lies with those charged with the administration of justice, and not with the legal precepts for the repression of crimes. POLITICAL NOTES.

There is not much to report today from the political world. The Council of State no quorumed on Wednesday, and the great question of return to constitutionality remains in abeyance awaiting the result of the meeting of legislators elect that was to have been held last night. The auguries for the success of the idea are still unfavorable, and the «Declaration» of the Nationalist Committee will probably have proved its death blow. We can only repeat that we regret the turn events are taking, and which is al-ready producing a renewed feeling of uneasiness in the market.

Yesterday's Siglo occupies itself once more with the electoral scandattention in the columns of so in-fluential and widely read a paper as also of Salto, but places itself entirely on the side of the turbulent electors there, forgetting that there are two sides to the question. It quite overlooks the fact that there must be some limit to what it calls the some limit to what it calls the sindependence of the electors—
that they have a task to fulfil which cannot be deferred indefinitely—
and that if such proceedings as those of Salto were to become general throughout the Republic, the elections would never come to an end at all nor could the Cham bers be constituted. It comes to this, that either the electors must elect within a given period or else must lose the privilege of electing. The law here, we believe, does not establish the latter penalty, so it has been put in force to compel the former course It the result is unsatslactory to the electors, it seems to us that they have mainly themselves to blame, especially when, as in the present case, they have not employed the methods indicated by the law to protect or secure their privileges, but have resorted to turbulent and irregular acts. The Siglo, in common with some other native papers, seems to think that it is a sign of sindeto think that it is a sign of sinde-pendences to oppose a candid ate and even to obstruct any election at all, merely because the candidate is colficially approved, but such an idea is sheer nonsense and if spread would soon render any system of government impossible. Such sindependence is merely that of the Bedouin Arab who rejects all control, discipline and organisation and is in effect, as

the Republic. The Nacion might have gone very much further in this direction without exceeding the truth.

Promulgation has been madelate enough in the day-of the Budget of the Municipality of Montevideo for the period 1898 99, which commenced on July 1st. The revenue, derived chiefly from various local rates and taxes, is estimated at \$1.021,970, and the expenditure at \$998.282, of which \$863.323 is consumed by the service of the Municipal Debt, the margin or surplus being \$23,688. Like the National Budget, this is monstrously high for the get, this is monstrously high for the size, requirements and population of the city, and a great deal of the money is wasted in extravagant ad-ministrative machinery. With such heavy rates and taxes to pay, no wonder there is constant complaint about the expense of living and house-keeping in the capital. Both Budgets require wholesale reduc-

THE GROWTH OF URUGUAYAN DEBT.

We have recently received the Investor's Review for November 20. In this we find a short article devoted to the growth of the Public Debt of this Republic The first part of it is devoted to the reproduction of figures taken from The Morra-VIDEO TIMES of October 90 and the remarks added by the Re iew are as follows: -

«From this summary it follows *From this summary it follows that in the thirteen years reviewed the debt of the Republic has increased by \$65,028,179, or say an average of rather more than \$500,000 a year. Uruguay, in other words, now owes considerably more than twice as much as it owed at the beginning of 1885. For all this money the country has next to nothing to show. It has not been rais-ed for public works, to bring in population, to develop resources, or extend commerce in any direction. It represents plunder in a great measure, plus the means found to gratify the demands of fluanciers whose business it is to maintain the so-called credit of the Republic in Europe on false pretences. As the MONTEVIDEO TIMES says, «If a Commission were appointed with instructions to report truthfully and unreservedly on the manner in which this \$65,000,000 has been employed, putting on one nas been employed, putting on one side the amount applied to legitimate public purposes and genuine necessities, and on the other the amount pilfered or wasted, the report would probably be one of the most startably be one of the most start-ling ever given to publicity in any part of the world. We quite endorse that statement. To us the manner in which Uruguay has been played with, stripped of its means, and literally eaten up by financial locusts, is one of the greatest scandals of our time.
