POLITICAL NOTES. The return to constitutionality

continues to be the topic of the day. For the moment we have no progress to report, awaiting information of what occurred in the Council of State yesterday. A writer in the Siglo points out that even it the new fegislators are convoked to preparatory sittings, and even if they decide to anticipate the date for the opening of their regular sessions, it by their regular sessions, it by no means follows that they will immediately proceed to the election of Sr Cuestas as President of the Republic. This is a mere quibble for there would be a mere quibble for there would be no object in their taking the one step without the other In fact, there are two things to be avoided, not one; namely, unnecessary prolongation of the unconstitutional regime and that highly inconvenient and dangerous absurdity an interregnum. The pertinacity with which the enemies of the situation and the opponents of Nr. Cuestas candidature insist on the interregnum is sufficient to show the danger attached to it, for they evinum is sufficient to show the danger attached to it for they evidently count upon it as the last opportunity for preventing Sr Cudstas from attaining to the definite presidency. The idea, however is based on an ulterly absurd misinterpretation of the Constitution, the supposition being that when the Chambers, meet they will fill the public before they fill the presid-ency, leaving an interval of two or more weeks between the two elections. There is not a single word in the Constitution to warrant such

an absurdity. At the meeting of the nationalist Committee on Saturday, Sr. Enri-que Anaya was elected to the pre-sidency of the party vacant by the death of Dr. Juan José de Herrera As regards the immediate return to constitution ality it was resolved to consult

ality it was resolved to consult the convention of the party which will be held at San José on January 8th. THE DESTRUCTION OF LOCUSTS. AN IMPORTANT DISCOVERY.

(South American Journal, Dec. 3.) The ravages caused by locusts

The ravages caused by locusts in Argentina and elsewhere have naturally caused all who are interested in these countries to give their attention to devising new methods for the extermination of these destructive pests. Many are the means which have been tried, with more or less success, but a complete solution of the problem has yet to be found. It will, therecomplete solution of the problem has yet to be found. It will, therefore, be interesting to many to hear of an entirely new departure. After a long series of experiments, conducted by Mr. John Samson, of this Journal, as sisted by an experienced an alytical chemist, a new toxine has been discovered, which appears, so far as can be judged from experiments, tried, to have some marvellous properties. In its conmarvellous properties. In its con highly poisonous, and great pre-cautions have to be taken in manufactoring or bandling it so it could hardly be made-up by farmers themselves. However, once the toxine is made up it is quite safe to handle with ordinary precautions. The composition of the toxine is, naturally, to be kept secret; but it may be mentioned that the logredient which gives it so much efficacy is a subtance which it will be extremely difficult to detect by an alysis. A sample let put up in one galleries alysis. A sample let put up in one gallon drums has now been dispatched to Argentina and the result of its use will be watched with great interest. The method of employing it is simply to didte it with about thirty times its volume of water, and adding a certain amount of sugar or molasses. Locusts will eat it with avdity and perish in thousands. In its diluted state the toxine is harmless to domestic animals and birds.

As many of our readers may desire to make an experiment with this wonderful new remedy Mr. Samson has made arrangements whereby sample tins of one gallon each can be supplied f.o.b. for 6s. each. It will be well to give prompt instructions, so as to get the toxine out before the locust season is

This would indicate the presence of rays belonging to the extreme ultra violet end of the spectrum, since it is known that these extreme earth was impossible. I should since it is known that these extreme ultra violet rays have the pow-er of passing through bodies opa-que to the longer wave lengths visible to the eye If this is so, they visible to the eye If this is so, they are probably the same as the invisible rays emitted by uranium and its saits, which have the power of passing through aluminum and cardbeard and are capable of reflection, refraction, and polarisation. These are known as Becque rel's rays. In short, therefore, we may say that the light of the firefly contains invisible photographic rays from the extreme violet and of the spectrum, in addition to the ordinary light rays. dinary light rays.

Turning now to the construction

of the light producing apparatus, it has been found by Max Scoultz that this organ in the glowworm that this organ in the glowworm coasists of a pale, transparent, superficial layer, which gives off the light, and a deep opaque layer, whose function is less obvious. The Italian firefly, in which both male and female are luminous, has been examined by Emery. Here, as in the glowworm, the organ was found to consist of two layers. It has also been found that the other It has also been found that the ultimate branches of the trachem, or air lubes, are distributed through the photogenic apparatus; nerve fi-bres are also present. The luminous organ in the firefly is regarded as homologous to the *fat body* often found in insects. Now, directing attention to the cause of the light; we are met by two very significant discoveries—first, that carbonic acid extinguishes the light; and, second, that oxygen intensities it. These facts, in conjunction with the known distribution of air tubes in the photogenic body, point very strongly to the theory that the light is the result of some form of slow combustion; while the fatty nature of the luminous cells indicates the probability of fat, with some form of free phosphorus, as

the active agent.

It may be added that, as regards light-producing animals in general, it has been found in a large number arrange. of them that the luminous organs relain their power after death, and even after desiccation and subsequent moistening. There would, therefore, seem no reason to adopt the theory that we have here to deal with any direct transform-ation of vital into radiant ener-

Sugar creates thirst, consequently lemonade, in existing circumstances, cannot be recommended; and even when made of fresh lemons it has a lowering effect upon the syslowering effect upon the sys-tem, which, taking into con-sideration the enormous waste gy. The most probable explanation of the phenomena, at least in the firefly and glowworm, is that it is the result of slow combustion. And yet, even granting this is the cause of the light, there remains to be explained why this form of slow combustion produces these extreme ultra violet rays, while other forms of combustion do not. There is some underlying mystery of molecular physics here well worth investigation.


