### MACDONALD EXPELLED FROM LABOUR PARTY

### Gandhi Will Attend the Round Table Conference

#### MACDONALD TO FORM A NEW NATIONAL GOVERNMENT

London August 26th  
Macdonald, after kissing the King's hands on his appointment as Prime Minister of the new government, hurried to Downing Street and began his preparations for the construction of a new national government, and held a lengthy conference with Mr. Stanley Baldwin and Sir Herbert Samuel and asked them to cooperate with him in the formation of such an administration.

#### CUBA APPARENTLY PEACEFUL

Havana, August 26th  
It is reported to be peaceful throughout Cuba and indications show that the morale of the rebels has been definitely broken.

Machado is now in a strong position to offer the opposition a compromise on the basis of the electoral plan previously rejected by the opposition, providing for reorganization of the parties and giving the opposition a chance to legally organize and enter the new presidential elections in 1932 instead of 1935.

#### EXPERTS COMMISSION MEETS AT GENEVA

Geneva, August 26th  
The creation for Europe of an international bank of exportations was the principal problem discussed by a commission of experts meeting under the auspices of the League of Nations. The meeting marked the resumption of activities by the various sub-committees of the European Union Commission which were adjourned last June to await the result of the Hoover war debt moratorium.

During the remainder of the month various sub-committees will meet in order to complete projects for Europe's economic restoration, and will be submitted to the fourth plenary session of the European Union Commission on September.

#### MONTEVIDEO AS A TRANS-SHIPMENT PORT MEASURES FOR FOSTERING THE TRANSIT TRADE

Deeming it of interest to Shipping generally, Mr. Enrique Dauber has favoured us with a copy of a translation which he has made on behalf of the Centro Navegacion Transatlantica, and which appeared recently in "La Mañana" and the issue of a New Tariff intended to foster the transit trade passing through our Port.

In conformity with the recommendation of the Finance Minister, the following decree was issued recently by the National Council of Administration:—

WHEREAS: in the interests of the advancement of the transit trade with Paraguay, Bolivia, Brazil and other South American countries using Montevideo as a

grams or cubic metre.

3rd. For direct discharge into trucks, when the transit operation is continued overland, the charge inclusive of labour and traction, shall be \$ 0.75 per thousand kilograms or cubic metre.

4th. For loading from truck to ship, inclusive of labour and traction services performed previously, \$ 0.75 per thousand kilograms or cubic metre.

5th. For entrance into, or withdrawal from, shed for delivery to, truck or ship, or vice-versa, inclusive of labour and traction, \$ 0.50 per thousand kilograms or cubic metre.

These tariffs shall apply also to goods consigned to other National Ports via Montevideo.

The Office for Reshipment of Cargoes ("Oficina de Reexpedición de Cargas"), in every case that comes under its scope, shall charge for its services at the rate

WHEREAS: the Board of the Port and Harbour Authority of Montevideo has advised the adoption of new Port Tariffs, the application of which would encourage trans-shipment operations effected by the countries aforesaid,

THEREFORE: pursuant to the provisions of Art. 20 of the law enacted on the twenty-first day of July in the year nineteen hundred and sixteen, the National Council of Administration decrees:

Art. 1 The following tariffs applicable to the transit trade passing through the Port of Montevideo, are hereby approved:

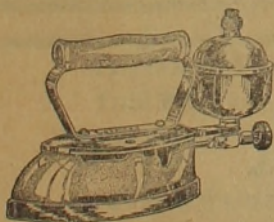
1st. Direct trans-shipment, i. e. from ship to ship, shall be effected free of charge, in accordance with existing Ordinances and corresponding Regulations.

2nd. In those cases where the trans-shipment is indirect and is carried out by means of lighters owned by the Port and Harbour Authority, the lighterage shall be fixed at \$ 1.50 per thousand kilo-

of \$ 0.50 per thousand kilograms or cubic metre; but with the exception of those instances where the trans-shipment is effected direct from ship to ship, and in which event the \$ 0.50 fee applicable, shall not exceed a total of \$ 9.40 irrespective of the tonnage handled.

Article 2. — Powers are hereby given to the Port and Harbour Authority to make special arrangements in exceptional cases where large quantities of merchandise, for one or successive shipments, are involved; and to arrange terms in connection with lighterage services, freights and storage of cargoes afloat.

Article 3. The Port and Harbour Authority of Montevideo aforesaid is hereby authorized to put into operation the other recommendations made in the Report presented by the Special Commission which was appointed for the purpose of studying and reporting on the means of extending the transit trade with the countries previously enumerated and the findings of which Special Commission were approved by the Board of the Port and Harbour Authority.

BRITISH FINANCE AND COMMERCE

British assurance as an industry stands by itself, and assurance of one form or other (life, fire, marine, etc.) constitutes one of the chief "invisible" exports of Great Britain. There is very little that happens in any part of the world which does not affect a general British assurance company. It follows that a general depression in trade must affect the assurance industry, so intimately related to the trade that it assists, and it is of interest to note that the chairman of one of the largest British assurance companies recently suggested that, on the basis of accounts issued, both banking and insurance suffered an estimated reduction of 20 per cent in real profits in 1930, as compared with those of the years immediately preceding. Some such reduction was inevitable in the circumstances, but that the general position of British assurance is sound may be gathered from a perusal of the following facts:

Take, for example, the case of British life assurance offices. The total funds entrusted by the policy-holders and annuitants to the care of these offices in the United Kingdom amounts approximately to £ 950 millions. Of this sum some £ 550-600 millions is invested in Stock Exchange securities. The last year has notoriously been one of declining values but such is the shrewdness with which the British life offices have placed their funds that in 1930 the great majority of these offices were able to announce an appreciation in the market values of the securities held by them. Of the remainder, there was not a single instance of any investment loss coming within measurable distance of causing a reduction even in bonus rates. In 1930 the funds of 50 British life assurance offices, who between them transact over 97 per cent. of the business done by all the life offices through

out Great Britain, increased from £ 665 millions to £ 689 million and the net annual premiums received by these offices rose from £ 59 millions to £ 62 millions. New sums (net) assured were £ 163 millions as against £ 157 millions in 1929.

As regards the next most important branch of British assurance, namely fire assurance, it may be said that this more than any other section bears evidence of the severe financial ordeal of 1930. Taken as a whole, however, the results of the year's trading are gratifying in the circumstances. Fire premium income received by 30 of the largest British fire offices amounted last year to £ 51 millions as against £ 55 millions in 1929 (also £ 55 millions in 1928 and 1927, the "peak" year being £ 56 millions in 1926). This reduction of 6 per cent is due to many causes, trade depression being the chief, but depreciated foreign currency has played its part. More than half of the premium income of British fire offices is derived from the United States, where the reduction in these premiums has amounted to about 11 per cent.

Last year the aggregate loss ratio of these 30 offices increased from 49.9 to 50.3 per cent. It is sometimes said that bad trade means a heavier loss ratio, as bad trade leads to greater carelessness than in time when goods and plant can be profitably employed. This is hardly the case in the United Kingdom for, according to the "Times" fire losses in 1930 were £ 9,016,000 as against £ 7,840,000 in 1929. At the end of May last the figure for the year 1931 was £ 250,000 better than in 1930. In the United States, on the other hand, fire losses in 1930

were £ 100 millions, or £ 8 millions more than in 1929. The aggregate funds of those fire offices remained unchanged at £ 91 millions.

Other forms of British assurance must be dealt with in a few words. Little material change has occurred during the last twelve months in the conditions in the British marine assurance market, which remains under the effects of the depression in the shipping industry. The chief event has been the entry of both the British and the French Governments into the market, to secure the adequate covering.

#### WEEKLY LONDON LETTER

#### DISARMAMENT

A striking demonstration was recently held in London. It was representative of all parties and all shades of religious thought. It was addressed by the Premier, Mr Ramsay Macdonald, leader of the Labour Party, Mr Stanley Baldwin, leader of the Conservative Party, and Mr. Lloyd George, leader of the Liberal Party. All were met together with the common object of denouncing the growth of armaments, and it was significant of the temper and sentiment of the British people that demonstration for such a purpose should have been such a signal success.

There was first a procession of many thousands of persons, who marched from the Embankment to the Albert Hall. It was led by the Women's International League, and there were delegates from a large number of other bodies. University women in their academic gowns, Indian women, negroes, women of the social services, men of the British Legion, representatives of the Unemployed, all were there to testify to Great Britain's will to peace. In the Albert Hall the flags of all nations were flown. The speeches were listened to with breathless attention. All the leaders spoke of the dangers inherent in the system of piling up armaments; of the tendency to indulge in a "race for armaments"

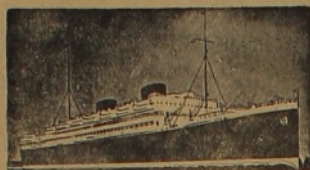

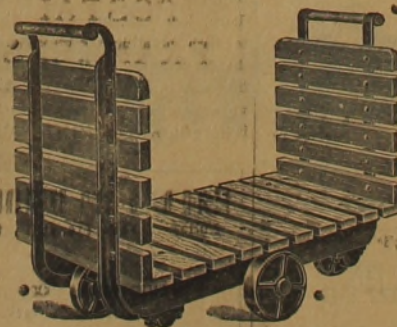
