LATEST FOREIGN NEWS

London, Monday, July 16. encouraging, and predicted that the party of Argyll's speech in the House of Lords on Thursday, specially taking exception to the way in which the Duke had stigmatised those who spoke on behalf of the Irish tenants, and traversing his statements as to the way in which political prisoners had been treated when Mr. Gladstone was in office. The Duke of Argyll must, he contended, have changed his views since he was the entertainer and friend of Garibaldi and of Italy. He maintained that the throwing out of Mr. Forster's Compensation for Disturbance Bill by the House of Lords was the beginning and origin of all the troubles that have taken place in Ireland since. But the Irish now know that the major ity of the British people were on their side, and that they had only to possess their souls in patience.

Mr. Chaplin, speaking at Hampstead on Saturday, denied that he intended in a recent speech in the House of Commons to taunt Mr. Gladstone with the infirmities of age, and added that if what he had said could be so construed no one would regret it more than himself.

Ademonstration organized by the Metropolitan Radical Federation took place in Hyde-park yesterday to protest against the imprisonment of Mr. Dillon, and to express sympathy with Mrs. Mandeville on her husband's death. Owing to the unfavourable state of the weather the assembly from various quarters of the metropolis converging in the park did not muster more than between two and three thousand persons.

A large number of persons assemble. in Trafalgar-square on Saturday afternoon to take part in another conversational meeting. The police were in strong force, and insisted upon anyone moving who endeavoured to cause an obstruction. Prominent among these present were Mr. C. Graham. M.P., Mr. Saunders, and the Rev. S.D. Heidlam. Mr. Saunders was hustled out of the square, and Mc. Headlam's but was buttered in. Mr. Graham was hurt, and applied at Bow-street for a summonagainst two policemen. He was requested to prepire an information.

A telegram from Kumberley received in Capetown states that sixty more natives have been rescued from the De Beers mine, making the total number 533. At hope of saving the remainder had been abandoned.

A telegram from Capetown announces the death of Sir J. H. Brand, President of the Orange Free State.

A letter from the Pope to the Bishops of Ireland was read at all the masses in Ireland yesterday. It reviews the circumstances attending the propagation of the recent Papal decree, and directs the Bishops to take all necessary steps that no room be left for doubt as to the force that so many Catholies, whose salvation ought to be the first care of the Bishops should pursue a hazardous and unsafe course, leading rather to disaster than to the relief of distress.

Special Correspondents at Portland and Portsmouth, send telegrams giving further information as to the sheps taking part in the Naval Manouvres. A Porcland Correspon lent says that as one result of the mobilisation hundreds of shortcomings have been revealed. It was expected that the fleets would sal during last night or early this morning.




