## FOREIGN NEWS

London, Friday, Sept. 14.  
Our Correspondent at New York telegraphs that Mr. Richard A. Proctor, the astronomer, died there of yellow fever on Wednesday night. He was on his way back to England from his farm in Florida.

The programme of yesterday's performance at the Herford Musical Festival, in the Cathedral, comprises Mr. Cohen's Melbourne Ode, Cherubini's Mass in D minor, and Professor Ouseley's "St. Polyxena." In the evening there was a miscellaneous concert in the Shire Hall.

Mr. Baldwin made his balloon ascent and descent by means of parachute at the Alexandra Palace last evening in the presence of a very large assemblage. He ascended to the height of six thousand feet, or a mile and 240 yards.

The Hastings cricket week began yesterday with a match between the North and South. The Southern team's first innings closed for 258. At Manchester, the second game between Shrewsbury's Eleven and the Australians was commenced, the former made a first innings total of 105, while the latter scored only 35.

At Doncaster, the Portland Plate was won by Mr. Leybourne's Goldseeker; Mr. M'Calmont's Castlenock being 2nd, and the Duke of Hamilton's Nina third. The other races resulted as follows: Scarborough Stakes, Sir G. Chetwynd's Grafton; Juvenile Stakes, Lord Dudley's King Cole; Rous Plate, Mr. W. T. Anson's Help; Alexandra Plate, Lord Ellesmere's Felix; Corporation Plate, Mr. W. R. Marshall's Hazlewood; Wharfedale Stakes, Mr. Childwick's Hugo; Zealand Stakes, Lord Zetland's Caerlaverock.

Proceedings against Mr. W. Redmond, M. P., on a charge of having incited the occupants of Somers' house at Coolree to resist the sheriff, were commenced at Westford yesterday, and had not concluded at the rising of the court.

The coroner's inquiry into the circumstances of the last Whitechapel murder was resumed yesterday, when evidence was given by the police inspector who examined the body of the deceased, and by Dr. Phillips, divisional surgeon of the H. division. The latter detailed the injuries received, and stated that the cause of death was the cutting of the throat, and that the other wounds must have been inflicted after death. In the course of the evidence it was shown that the stripping and washing of the body had been done in consequence of instructions from the Board of Guardians, and not by any order from the police. The inquest was adjourned till Wednesday next.

On the application of Mr. Boley, Mr. d'Eyncourt consented yesterday to state a case with respect to his recent decision against the Road Car Company for changing horses at Parliament-square.

At the Westminster Police-court yesterday Mr. d'Eyncourt had before him the charge against Mr. A. E. Whitehouse, of the Hyde Park Gallery, St. George's-place, Knightsbridge, of pirating and multiplying for sale the registered copyright photographs of Messrs. Adolphe Braun and Co., of Paris. Mr. d'Eyncourt ordered the defendant to forfeit 10l. to the complainants and five guineas costs, but granted a stay of execution to enable the defendant to consider if he should ask for a case to be stated.

A resident in Westminster, Mrs. Potter, appeared at the Police Court of that district yesterday, and stated that she had reason to believe that the arm found in the river off Putney was that of her daughter, 17 years of age, who had been missing from home since last Saturday morning.

## BRAZILIAN NEWS

(Rio News Oct. 5.)

The man Silos who killed the reducer of his wife on July 27th last, was acquitted by the jury on the 25th ult. on the ground of self-defense.

The Rio de Janeiro provincial assembly is consistent: the proposal to have a committee present at the ceremony on the 25th ult. was rejected. The Princess was much affected by this action.

The premier has received from the Pope the order of St. IX, and the ministers of justice and foreign affairs grand crosses of St. Gregory, the Great. Let us hope these crosses will be physical and not moral.

The proposition of the government to sell or lease the water-works of this city has aroused violent opposition on all sides, and it has therefore been abandoned.

On Sunday the 25th ult., the *Diário de Notícias* says, a woman was seen begging in our streets for money to bury her child, and was carrying the dead infant in her arms. What in the world are the police doing that so disgusting a scene may be possible.

According to the observations made by the City Improvements Co. the average maximum temperature for August was 72.9° in the shade, and the average minimum 68.8° Fahr. The total rainfall was 14.7 millimetres, and the average death rate 26.3 per thousand per annum.

From recent correspondence exchanged between the minister of war and the chief of police of the province of Rio, it appears that when a man is too bad to serve as a policeman, he is sent to enlist in the army. Truly, the position of a Brazilian army officer is not a bed of roses.

H. B. M.'s ironclad *Triumph*, formerly flagship of the Pacific squadron, arrived here on the 25th ult. from Valparaiso, homeward bound, and sailed on the 3rd inst.

We deeply regret to hear of the death in Paris of Emile Deleau, formerly editor of the once popular organ of the French colony in this city, the *Messager du Brésil*. On the suspension of the *Messager*, M. Deleau accepted a commission in Europe from the government, where he became an ardent advocate of emigration to Brazil. He afterwards settled in Paris as the correspondent of the *Gazeta de Notícias*. He was a writer of exceptional ability and good judgment.

The minister of finance estimates the general receipts for next year at 140,000,000 and ordinary expenses at 138,108,670\$58. The extraordinary expenditures already voted amount to 13,851,124\$. Allowing an increase of 1,000,000\$ in the estimated receipts, the prospective deficit is 10,032,791\$51. By calculating on impossible economies and uncertain deposits, and by ignoring many items of expenditure, cash advances to planters, etc., this deficit may be considerably reduced—on paper.

It seen pretty well decided that the abolition law was a serious mistake. The planters can not gather their crops, and the freedmen object to working under the old regime. Brazil is bound to reach an abyss of misery, from which there is no drawing back. Once the planters can not gather their crops, ruination is imminent. Let other coffee producing countries trim their sails, to avail of Brazil's misfortune. If the curious reader does not believe all this, let him spend a day or two at the Senate and Chamber and hear what our Solons have to say about it.

The ceremony of presenting to Golden Rose to the Princess Regent took place at the Imperial Chapel on the 25th ult., the 17th anniversary of the Rio Branco law. The presentation was made by the Pope's internuncio, Monsignor Spolverini, in the presence of a crowded assemblage of officials, diplomats, and important personages. There was a military display in the streets, and a large number of people assembled to see the ceremonies. The day was rainy, which detracted somewhat from the brilliancy of the display.

The immigrant arrivals at this port during the month of September numbered 2,230, of which 906 were Italians, 894 Portuguese, 216 Spaniards, 123 French, 45 Germans, and the balance of diverse nationalities. In the same month 827 passed through this port for Santos, and 847 took passage for foreign destinations, of which 701 returned to Europe. The arrivals from Europe at Santos were 1,231, making 6,461, for both ports, of which 1,751 were Italians and 1,518 Portuguese. According to official returns the total arrivals for the last nine months number 75,763, of which 25,849 entered at Rio and 49,914 at Santos.

In September the mint coined 118,000\$ in silver for private parties; the amount coined for government account is not given.

The supplementary credit (to the minister of empire of 257,572\$465 for public relief in the year 1886-87 has received imperial sanction.

The minister of finance, in his estimates for 1889, is counting upon 6,000,000\$ for the emancipation fund. What, in the name of common sense, has Brazil to do with an emancipation fund in 1889? Does the government propose to continue emancipation taxes to the end of the world? Is the treasury so good a place that it never lets go even when pained with blood?

Decree No. 10,011 dated on the 22nd September, orders civil registry of births, marriages and deaths throughout the empire from January 1, 1889. It appears that the contract for the registry books was given to a firm here, which was obliged to import them from Germany.

A conflict took place on the naval vessel *Montevideo* on the 24th ult., resulting in the killing of a boatswain by a drunken and insubordinate sailor for refusing to turn in, and when about to be placed under arrest seized a boarding pike and gave the boatswain a blow in the breast from which he died a few hours later. The *Imparcial* mentions that the cause of the disturbance appears to be far more dangerous in peace than in war.

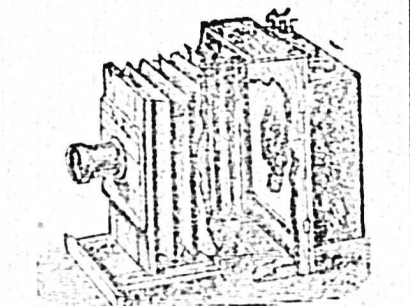

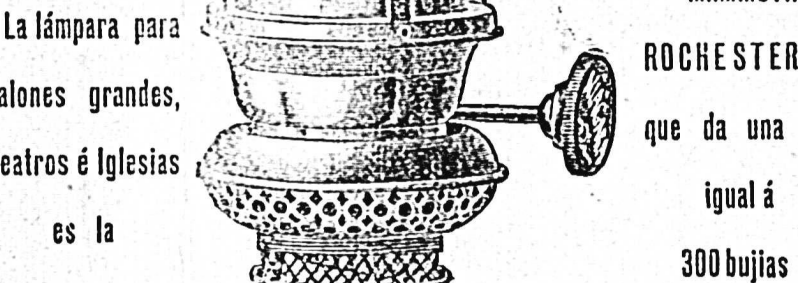
