"Nay, I can almost say the third, for I could not look on Prince Gortschakoff as an advocate of the Russian policy as it was then represented by its real champion, Count Schouvaloff. During the whole Congress there came to my knowledge no Russian wish which I did not advocate and even carry through, in consequence of the trust reposed in me by Lord Beaconsfield (now, alas, dead). At the most difficult and critical moment of the Congress, I came to that statesman's bedside in the middle of the night, and at a time when the Congress threatened to break up, and succeeded in procuring his consent to my proposal. In fact, my behaviour at the Congress was such that as it approached its close I got the highest Russian Order in brilliants, otherwise I should be sure to get it now, (Laughter.) In short, I felt that I had carned well of a foreign Power to an extent which has rarely been youchsafed to an alier Minister. What therefore was my surprise and my disappointment to find that there gradually developed itself in St. Petesburg a kind of press campaign by which German policy was attacked and my personal intentions assailed. These attacks culminated in the following year, 1870, in strong demands that we should exercise pressure on Austria in matters where we could not without more ado question Austrian preregative. In this I could not lend my hand, for if we estranged ourselves from Austria we should then have necessarily become dependent on Russia, unless we wished to stand quite isolated in Europe. But would such a dependence have been endurable? 




